# 2.Get Started

Before you begin, you need to prepare your phone by installing the SIM card, which is supplied by the service provider.


#### Notice:

The SIM card can be easily damaged by scratching or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting or removing the card. Follow the SIM manual supplied by the manufacturer.

Please keep SIM card out of the reach of children. If the card is lost, please contact your service provider.

## Install The SIM Card and Battery

- (1) Press and hold **o** for about 2 seconds to switch off the phone.
- (2) With the back of the phone facing you, slide the cover in the direction of the arrow to remove it. Then, remove the battery.




(3) Insert the SIM card into the holder as shown, unbeveled corner first, with the gold colored contacts on the SIM card facing down.

(4) Position the battery so the gold colored contacts match up with those in the battery slot. Snap the bottom part of the battery into place. Then, re-install the battery cover.



Notice :

- 1. When inserting the SIM card, make sure the beveled corner matches up with the card holder.
- 2. If you can not switch on the phone after installing the battery, please check the battery power or re-install the battery.

# Charge The Battery

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable Li-ion battery. A travel charger is supplied with the phone when you purchase. When charging is in progress, you can still use your phone as usual.


#### CHARGE WITH A TRAVEL CHARGER

(1) Install the battery properly.

- (2) Plug the connector of the travel adapter into the jack at t he bottom of the phone.
- (3) Plug the adapter into a standard AC wall outlet.



- (4) If your phone is on, the battery power indicator appears on the screen and starts scrolling.
- (5) When battery charge is complete, disconnect the charger from the standard wall outlet first and then from the phone.

#### Notice:

- If the battery power is completely used up, the battery power indicator appears 2 or 3 minutes after you start charging. In general, the charging time should be 2 to 5 hours.
- 2. The full performance of a new battery is achieved only after two or three complete charge and discharge cycles. It's suggested that each of the first two or three charging times lasts for over 10 hours. Don't charge the battery until the battery charge gets too low to operate the phone.
- When the phone battery is removed or the battery power gets too low, reinstall a new one or charge the battery as soon as possible; otherwise, the phone time will be reset.

#### Important:

Use batteries and chargers approved by Meridian Mobile for use only. Using

unapproved batteries or chargers may cause explosion.

# Battery Strength Indicator

When the battery is low, the empty battery icon Image: blinks, the
"Battery low" message displays on the screen and a warning tone
sounds.

When the battery charge level is too low for operation, the phone switches itself off and all data that has not been saved will be lost.

# Switch On/Off Your Phone

#### SWITCH THE PHONE ON

+ Press and hold 7 to switch on the phone.

🤟 Warning:

Do not switch the phone on or activate any auto power-on function wher wireless phone use is prohibited or when it may cause interference or danger.



Warning:

Your phone has a built-in antenna. Do not touch the antenna unnecessarily when the phone is switched on; otherwise, it may affect call quality and may cause the phone to operate at a higher power level than otherwise needed.

- + If your phone asks for a PIN code, enter the PIN code. You can obtaine the PIN code from your service provider. The default code is 0000.
- If you enter an incorrect PIN code three times in succession, PIN code is locked. You need to enter a PUK code to unlock it. Read "Safety information" on page 49 for more details.

#### SWITH THE PHONE OFF

# 3. Call Functions

# Make a call

Before making a call, check the signal strength to make sure you are in a place with strong enough signal for communication.

- (1) In the standby mode, enter the area code and phone number.
- (2) Press *c* to dial.

#### Notice :

When entering a phone number, you can press and hold # to insert a pause (P) between the switchboard and the extension number. The extension number will be dialed after the switchboard number is put through.

#### MAKE AN INTERNATIONAL CALL

Enter the country code, area code and phone number. Then, press to dial. If necessary, press and hold  $\bigcirc +$  to insert a Plus (+) symbol before entering the country code.

#### HOLD A CALL AND MAKE ANOTHER (NETWORK SERVICE)

You can put the current call on hold, and then make another call.

- (1) When you are on a call, use the keypad to enter another phone number.
- (2) Press to make the new call and the first call is automatically put on hold.

#### SWITCH CALLS (NETWORK SERVICE)

When you have one active call and one on-hold call, you can press

• key and select [ Swap ] to switch between the active call and the on-hold one.

#### **USE SMART DIAL**

In the standby mode, enter a phone number and press  $\bullet$  to access the following options:

- + Append number: Enter [Smart dial].
- + Send message: Edit a message to be sent to the phone number you entered.
- + Guide: Turn on or off the smart dial guide. When set to [On], the phone displays "\*: smart dial" when you enter any numbers in the standby mode.

#### REDIAL A DIALED CALL

In the standby mode, press 
to open a list of your recent outgoing calls. Select your desired call record and press 
to dial.

#### LISTEN TO YOUR VOICEMAIL

When you have a new voice message, a warning tone sounds. You can dial the voice mail box number to listen to the voice message received.

In the standby mode, press and hold  $|^{\,\omega\star}$  key to dial the voice mailbox number.

#### MAKE AN EMERGENCY CALL

Enter the emergency phone number and press *content* to dial.

#### ADJUST CALL VOLUME

During a call, you can simply press (()/) to adjust the call volume,

# Answer or Reject A Call

When your service provider supports caller ID and it is enabled, your phone shows the caller's phone number when there's an incoming call. If the caller's phone number has been stored in your phbook, your phone shows the name assigned to the phone number.

#### ANSWER A CALL

You can answer a call in the following ways:

- + Answer key : when you select [Settings→Call setup→Answer mode→Answer key], you can press or ● to answer a call.
- + Flip open answer : when you select [ Settings→Call setup→ Answer mode→Flip open answer ] , you can open the flip cover to answer a call.
- + Any key answer : when you select [ Settings→Call setup→
   Answer mode→Any key answer ], you can press any key except on and o to answer a call.
- + Auto answer : when you select [ Settings -> Call setup -> Answer

**mode** $\rightarrow$ **Auto answer**] and when a hands-free kit is used, the phone will automatically answer an incoming call in around 3 seconds. You can also press  $\frown$  key to answer the call before the phone automatically answers it.

# HOLD A CALL AND ANSWER ANOTHER (NETWORK SERVICE)

If you have activated call waiting function, your phone gives off a warning tone when you have another incoming call during an active call. You can:

  to answer the second call, with the active call automatically put on hold.
- + Press or to reject the second call.

#### MAKE A CONFERENCE CALL (NETWORK SERVICE)

Conference calling is a network service that allows up to six persons to take part in a conference call. Call waiting function should be activated to use the conference calling service. Refer to "Call waiting" on page 42 for more details.

- (1) When you are on a call with the first participant and a new participant is trying to reach you, answer the new call with the first one to be put on hold.
- (2) Press key and select [ Add to conference ] to connect the calls. During the conference call, you can press to access the following options:

End all calls	End the conference call.

# **4.**Recent Calls

Your phone keeps up to 30 records of missed, answered and outgoing calls each. For the [**Recent calls**] to work properly, your service provider must support caller ID and it must be enabled, your calls cannot be blocked, and your phone must be on and within the service area.

# Missed Calls

This menu stores your missed calls. In the standby mode, press ● key and select [ **Recent calls**→**Missed calls** ] to view the missed calls. Refer to "**Outgoing calls**" on page 14 for more details.

# Answered Calls

This menu stores your answered calls. In the standby mode, press ● key and select [ **Recent calls**→**Answered calls** ] to view the answered calls. Refer to "**Outgoing calls**" on page 17 for more details.

# Outgoing Calls

This menu stores your outgoing calls. You can enter the [Outgoing calls] menu in the following ways:

+ In the standby mode, press ● key and select [ Recent calls→

Outgoing calls ] .

- + In the standby mode, press *m* key to enter.
  - Select your desired outgoing call record and press OK key to view the detailed information.

# 5. Text Entry

Your phone adopts eZi predictive input mode. You can use the following methods for entering text and numbers.

- + eZiEng : A predictive text input method that allows you to enter any character using single keystrokes.
- + Abc : Press a key once to insert the first letter on the key, twice for the second letter etc. If you pause briefly, the last letter in the display is accepted and your phone awaits the next entry.
- + 123 : Number mode that enables you to enter numbers. Press the keys corresponding to the digits you want.

## Insert Symbols

You can press **o** key to exit the symbol bar and press  $O \neq$  key to insert a blank ( except in 123 method ).

# 6.Phbook

You can store phone numbers in your SIM card and in your phone's memory. The SIM card and phone's memory are physically separate, but they are used as a single entity called Phbook.

#### PHBOOK ENTRIES

- Phone entries: You can save up to 300 contact entries in the phone. Each entry can contain a name, mobile phone number, office phone number and home phone number.
- SIM card entries: Each contact entry in SIM card can contain a name and a mobile phone number. The amount of entries that you can save in SIM card depends on the memory of your SIM card.

### Smart Dial

In the standby mode, press hey to enter [Smart dial] menu.

OR,

> In the standby mode, press O key to enter [ Phbook ] and

select [ **Smart dial** ] . You can know the storage location according to the icon on the left of the name.

#### SEARCH FOR A CONTACT IN SMART DIAL

In the [**Smart dial**] menu, you can find a contact by pressing in sequence the numeric keys corresponding to the entry name. For example, to find '**John**', just press numeric keys 5-6-4-6 in sequence.

With a contact entry found in the [Smart dial], you can:

### Add New Entry

and a number. To add a new SIM contact, enter the name and mobile phone number, and then press  $\bullet$  to save.

#### ADD TO PHONE

Each entry saved in the phone can contain a name, mobile phone number, office phone number and home phone number. To add a new phone contact, enter the fileds you want and press  $\bullet$  to save.

## Speed Dial

# **13.** Care and Maintenance

Your phone is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you protect your warranty coverage and enjoy your phone for many years.

- + Keep your phone and its enhancements out of reach of small children.
- + Keep your phone dry. Precipitation, humidity and all types of liquids or moisture can contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits. If your phone does get wet, remove the battery immediately and take the phone to your nearest authorized service center for help.
- + Do not use or store the phone in dusty or dirty areas. Its moving parts and electronic components can be damaged.
- + LCD display screen is susceptible to damage. Do not drop or shake the phone or touch the screen with sharp object.
- + Do not store the phone in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries, and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the phone in cold areas. When the phone returns to its normal temperature, moisture can form inside the phone and damage electronic circuit boards.
- + Do not drop, knock or shake the phone. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards and fine mechanics.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents or strong detergents to clean the phone. Clean your phone with a soft fabric dipped with suds if necessary.
- + Do not paint the phone. Paint can clog the moving parts and prevent proper operation.

If your phone does not work properly, read the followings to see if you can find a solution. If none of them helps, contact your nearest service center for help.

# Your phone cannot be switched on

Possible reason	What should you try?

The battery power is used up.	Charge the battery.
The battery is improperly installed.	Reinstall the battery.

# Your phone switches itself off

Possible reason	What should you try?
The auto power-off function is activated.	Deactivate auto power-off function.
The battery charge is too low.	Charge the battery.

# PIN/PUK codes are locked

Possible reason	What should you try?
Wrong PIN/ PUK codes are entered.	If PIN code is locked, enter PUK code to unlock. But if you enter an incorrect PUK code ten times in succession, SIM card will be permanently blocked and cannot be used anymore. Then ask your service provider or SIM card vendor for a new one.



Note:

- If you enter an incorrect PIN code for three times in succession, many functions of the SIM card will be disabled. Read "Safety Information" on page 50 for more details.
- 2. If you are not sure about PIN/PUK codes, contact your service provider.

# **The battery does not charge properly**

The charger is not properly connected to the phone.	Reconnect the charger plug to the phone connector until you see the charging icon on the phone screen.

# **15.** Safety Information

# Operating environment

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area where you use your phone.

- + Switch off your phone near a refueling point, bunker, chemical plant or blasting. Follow any restrictions. Not following them may cause an explosion or even death.
- + Your phone can cause interference and danger in aircraft. Therefore, ensure that your phone is switched off during the flight.
- + Put your phone at a special rack while driving. Do not put it at the seat or any places where it may drop. Do not use your wireless phone while driving. If you do need to use it, use the hands-free car kit or park the car first.

## Medical devices

Operation of any radio transmitting equipment, including wireless phones, may interfere with the functionality of inadequately protected medical devices. Consult a physician or the manufacturer of the medical device to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF energy or if you have any questions. Switch off your phone in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

#### Pacemaker

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 6 inch (15.3cm) be maintained between a wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To minimize the potential for interference, persons with pacemakers should:

- + Always keep the phone more than 6 inches (15.3cm) from their pacemaker when the phone is switched on.
- + Not carry the phone in a breast pocket.
- + Hold the phone to the ear opposite to the pacemaker.

Warning:

If you have any reason to suspect that interface is taking place, switch off the phone immediately. Consult the physician for more information.

## Hearing aid

Your phone may interfere with some hearing aids. If interference occurs, consult the manufacturer of the hearing aids.

# Emergency calls

Wireless phones, including this phone, operate using radio signals, wireless networks, landline networks and user-programmed functions. Because of this, connections in all conditions cannot be guaranteed. You should never rely solely on any wireless phone for essential communications like medical emergencies.

#### Make an emergency call

- (1) If the phone is not on, switch it on. Check for adequate signal strength.
- (2) Enter the official emergency number for your present location. Emergency numbers vary by location.
- (3) Press result key to dial.

🤳 Important:

When making an emergency call, give all the necessary information as accurately as possible. Your wireless phone may be the only means of communication at the scene of an accident. Do not end the call until given permission to do so

## Access Codes

#### Phone password

This code, supplied with the phone, protects your phone against unauthorized use. The phone password is preset to 0000. After you buy the phone, reset the phone password as soon as possible.

#### PIN code

This code, supplied with the SIM card, protects the card against unauthorized use. When you set on the PIN code request, the code is requested each time the phone is switched on.

#### Warning:

If you enter an incorrect PIN code three times in succession, the SIM card is blocked. You must enter the PUK code to unblock the SIM card and set a new PIN code. If you do not have the PUK code, contact your service provider or SIM card vendor immediately. Do not enter any characters at random.

#### PIN2 code

This code is supplied with some SIM cards and is required to access some certain special functions of the card. If you enter an incorrect PIN2 code three times in succession, PIN2 code is blocked and you will be asked for the PUK2 code to unblock it.

## PUK code

This code may be supplied with the SIM card. If you do not have the code, contact your service provider or SIM card vendor. If you enter an incorrect PUK code ten times in succession, SIM card is void and cannot be used anymore. Ask your service provider or SIM card vendor for a new one. PUK code is unchangeable.

### PUK2 code

This code may be supplied with the SIM card. If you enter an incorrect PUK code ten times in succession, some certain functions will be inactivated. If necessary, ask your service provider or SIM card vendor for a new one. PUK2 code cannot be changed. If you lost the code, contact your service provider or SIM card vendor.

# Charging and discharging

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable li-ion battery. Standby and talk times may vary, depending on the operating environment and settings in the phone.

- + Use only Meridian Mobile approved batteries and chargers. Meridian Mobile takes no responsibility for any damage caused by using unapproved batteries or chargers.
- + When your phone is on and charging is in progress, the battery bar appears on the screen and starts scrolling. When you charge the battery with your phone switched off, an animation indicating that charging is in progress appears on the screen.

## Note:

If the battery power is completely used up, the battery bar appears 2 or 3 minutes after you start charging. The charging time should be 2-5 hours.

- + Do not touch the battery or charger with wet hands when charging is in progress to avoid any potential danger.
- + When charging is complete, the battery bar stops scrolling. Unplug the charger from the wall outlet and the phone.

Jips:

The full performance of a new battery is achieved only after two or three complete charge and discharge cycles. It's suggested that the first two or three charging times last for over 10 hours.

## Precautions when using batteries

- + Never use any charger or battery that is damaged in any way.
- If you use the phone near the network's base station, it uses less power. Standby and talk times are greatly affected by the signal strength on the cellular network and the parameters set by the network operator.
- + Battery charging time depends on the remaining battery charge, the type of battery and the charger used. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will gradually wear out. When the operation time is noticeably shorter than normal, buy a new one.
- + Using unapproved batteries and chargers may cause an explosion. Unplug the charger from the wall outlet and the phone when not in use. Do not leave the battery connected to a charger for over one week. Overcharging may shorten the battery's lifetime. If left unused, even a fully charged battery will lose its charge over time.
- + When installing the battery, do not reverse the positive (+) and negative (-) terminals.
- + Leaving the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a closed car in summer or winter conditions, will reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery. Always try to keep or use the battery in normal temperature.
- + Do not short-circuit the battery. Accidental short-circuiting can occur when a metallic object such as coin, clip or pen causes direct connection of the positive (+) and negative (-) terminals of the battery. (These look like metal strips on the battery.) This might happen, for example, when you carry a spare battery in
