

SAFETY INFORMATION FOR WIRELESS HANDHELD PHONES

Read this information before using your handheld portable cellular Telephone.

EXPOSURE TO RADIO FREQUENCY SIGNALS

Your wireless handheld portable telephone is a low power radio transmitter and receiver.

When it is ON, it receives and also sends out radio frequency (RF)signals.

In August 1996, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted RF exposure

guidelines that are consistent with the safety standards previously set by both U.S and

international standards bodies:

•ANSI C95.1 (1992)

•NCRP Report 88(1986)

•ICNIRP (1996)

Those standards were based on comprehensive and periodic evaluations of the relevant

scientific literature. For example, over 120 scientists, engineers, and physicians from

universities, government health agencies, and industry reviewed the available body of

research to develop the ANSI Standard (C95.1). The design of your phone complies with the

FCC guidelines (and those standards).

ANTENNA CARE

Use only the supplied or an approved replacement antenna. Unauthorized antennas,

modifications, or attachment could damage the phone and may violate FCC regulations.

PHONE OPERATION

Normal Position: Hold the phone as you would any other telephone with the antenna pointed

up and over your shoulder.

The meanings of the acronyms are:

ANSI: American National Standards Institute

NCRP: National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements

ICNIRP: International Commission on Non-ionizing Radiation Protection

Tips on Efficient Operation:

For an efficient operation of your phone:

- Extend your antenna fully
- Do not touch the antenna unnecessarily when the phone is in use. Contact with the antenna affects call quality and may cause the phone to operate at a higher power level than otherwise needed.

DRIVING

Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless telephones in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. Also, if using your phone while driving, please:

- Give full attention to driving-driving safety is your first responsibility.
- · Use hands-free operation, if available.
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from RF signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless phone.

Pacemakers

The health industry Manufacturers Association recommends that a minimum separation of six (6") inches be maintained between a handheld wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research by and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research.

Persons with pacemakers:

Should ALWAYS keep the phone more than six (6") inches from their pacemaker when the phone is turned ON.

Should not carry the phone in a breast pocket.

Should use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference.

If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, turn your phone OFF immediately.

Hearing Aids

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your service provider [or call the customer service line to discuss alternatives.

Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining the necessary information.

Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding your vehicle. You should also consult the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Posted Facilities

Turn your phone OFF in any facility where posted notices so require.

AIRCRAFT

FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while in the air. Switch OFF your phone before boarding an aircraft.

BLASTING AREAS

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn your phone OFF when in a "Blasting area" or in areas posted "Turn off two-way radio". Obey all signs and instructions.

POTENTIALLY EXPLOSIVE ATMOSPHERES

Turn your phone OFF when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.

Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often marked but not always clearly marked. They include fueling areas such as gasoline stations, below deck on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane), areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as: grain, dust, or metal powders, and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.

For Vehicles Equipped with an Air Bag

An air bag inflates with great force. DO NOT place objects, including both installed or portable wireless equipment, in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If in-vehicle wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.

PRECAUTIONS

Your handheld Portable Telephone is a high quality piece of equipment. Before operating the equipment, read all instructions and cautionary markings on (1) AC Adapter, (2) Battery and (3) Product using Battery.


- 1. DO NOT use this equipment in an extreme environment where high temperature or high humidity exists.
- 2. DO NOT abuse the equipment. Avoid striking, shaking or shocking. When not using the unit, lay down the unit to avoid possible damage due to instability.
- 3. DO NOT expose this equipment to rain or spilled beverages.
- 4. DO NOT use unauthorized accessories.
- 5. DO NOT disassemble the phone or its accessories. If service or repair is required, return it to the service center. If the unit is disassembled, the risk of electronic shock or fire may result.
- 6. To prevent injury or burns, DO NOT allow metal objects to contract or short circuit the battery terminals.
- 7. DO NOT open the battery case. If the battery is accidentally broken, avoid skin contact with the internal chemical contents. If there is skin contact, wash the affected area immediately and seek immediate medical advice.
- 8. DO NOT put the battery close to, nor dispose it into fire.
- 9. The product that you have purchased contains a rechargeable battery. At the end of its useful life, under various state and local laws, it may be illegal to dispose of this battery into the municipal waste stream. 


Phone Layout

Front








USING THE BATTERY

Installing the Battery Pack

- 1. Insert the hook at the end of the Battery Pack into the slot at the end of the phone.
- 2. Press the Battery Pack down to lock the Battery Pack onto the phone.
- 3. Press the battery down until you hear a click.





Removing the Battery Pack

If you want to remove the battery, proceed as follows:

- 1. Make sure to turn the power off before removing the Battery Pack.
- 2. Slide Back the Release Latch as shown below.
- 3. Lift up to remove the Battery Pack from the phone gently.



Note: The battery must be correctly placed in the battery compartment.

If battery is incorrectly inserted, the handset will not turn on or the battery may slip out during use.


Recharging the Battery

A rechargeable Li-ion battery powers your GDM-100.

To recharge the Battery, always install the Battery to the phone

The phone can be used while charging if it is switched on.

1. Insert the Connector from the charger to the base of the Phone.



- 2. Connect the charger to an AC wall outlet.
 - : The lamp marked on the front of the charger turns red, during charging. When the battery is fully charged, the lamp turns green.
- 3. Disconnect the charger
 - : Full out the Connector from Phone with pushing both side buttons on Connector.

The Battery is not charged fully when you buy the Phone, but there may be enough power to turn the Phone on.

It is normal that Battery may become a little warmer during recharging.

We recommend that you charge the Battery until the indicator on the phone shows a green light.

The recharging time, from empty to full, depends on the environmental temperature,0 to +35 ° C.

Battery Type	Recharging Time
Standard lithium Ion	2.5 to 3.0h

Note 1. Do not feed the power to the Phone without Battery Pack.

IMPORTANT BATTERY INFORMATION

The Battery Indicator

In the upper right corner of your phone's display, there is a battery indicator filled with three segments. The more segments you see, the greater the charge.









When the battery is weak and only a few minutes of talk time remain, the battery icon will blink. You will also hear a warning tone. When the battery becomes too weak for the phone to operate, it turns off automatically.

Power Management

Battery	Type	Talk Time	Standby Time

(*The test result above is from Giga Telecom's Lab.)

Use only batteries and charges approved by the phone manufacturer.

When a charger is not in use, disconnected it from the power source. Do not leave the battery connected to a charger for longer than a week; overcharging may shorten its life. If left unused, a fully charged battery may completely drain (discharge) in 1-4 weeks.

Never use any charger or battery that is damaged or worn out.

Use the battery only for its intended purpose.

Do not short circuit the battery. Accidental short-circuiting can occur when a metallic object (e.g. coin, dip or pen) causes direct connection of the two terminals of the battery (metal strips on the back of the battery)

For example, when you carry a spare battery in your pocket or purse. Short-circuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the connecting object.

Leaving the battery in hot or cold places, such as in a closed car in summer or winter conditions, reduces the capacity and lifetime of the battery. Always try to keep the battery between 41 $^{\circ}$ F and 95 $^{\circ}$ F(5 $^{\circ}$ C and 35 $^{\circ}$ C).

A phone with a hot or cold battery may temporarily not work (or change) even if the battery is fully charged

Temperature extremes affect the ability of your battery to charge; allow it to cool down or

warm up first.

When the battery is not use, store it unchanged in a cool, dark and dry place.

The battery is a sealed unit with no serviceable parts. Do not attempt to open the case.

It is recommended that you allow your battery to fully discharge before you recharge it.

The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times but will eventually wear out.

When the operating time is shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.

Do not dispose of a battery in a fire!

Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations.

Recycle.

LCD DISPLAY INDICATORS

The display is comprised of two areas: an upper line of static icons and the lower text and graphic area. The following icons display at power-on.



Items	Descriptions
Y.d	Displays your current signal strength. The more lines you have, the stronger your signal.
4	Appears when a call or short message service is in progress.
Wild	Indicates when the vibration mode or etiquette is set to ON.
Ø	Indicates when the lamp feature is set to ON or the ringer volume is set to 0.
Ä	Indicates when you have messages waiting. (It will disappear after you have viewed the message.) Short message Voice message Short + Voice message
©	Indicates when the alarm or promises is set to ON.
•	Indicates when you are on another service provider s network.

(III)	Shows the level of your battery charge. The more bars you see, the more power you have left. When the charge is low, this icon blinks and an alert tone is sounded.

GETTING STARTED

+Turning The Phone On And Off

When you're ready to turn your phone on, check to see that the charged battery has been installed on the back of the phone.

- 1. Open the flip cover.
- 2. Hold down the key for more than one second to switch the phone on.

The red light flashes and an alert sounds at the same time.

When the system locates services, the greeting message displays along with the date and time. You can now place and receive calls.

If the system cannot locate service, the greeting message displays without the date and time. In this case, you cannot place and receive calls. You can try later when service is available.

3. When you wish to turn the phone off, hold down **key** for more than one second.



+Locking or unlocking the your phone:

In standby mode, press and hold kev. Lock:

Press and hold **key** and enter secrete number (4 digits). Unlock:

Initial values are "0000".

When the phone is locked:

- +The indicator [] is shown.
- +You can answer, end a call in the normal way.
- +Calls may be possible to the emergency number programmed into your phone.

+Antenna Position

The antenna can be used in its fully extended or fully retracted position only. It is recommended that the antenna should be fully extended for optimum performance and signal strength or while operating in poor signal areas.

+Network services

A number of features included in this guide are called Network Services. They are special services provided by wireless service providers. Before you can take advantage of any of these network Services, you must subscribe to these service(s) from your home service provider and obtain instructions for their use.

+How to Input characters

Press a number several times until the desired letter appears. (A number ahead of "P" means how many times you should press until the desired letter appears.)

At first, a capital letter appears when a character has been entered. You can change a capital letter into a small letter or a small letter into a capital letter using Navigation down key. After two seconds, the cursor will automatically advance to the next space once

character has been entered. If you make a mistake, press to correct last letter you entered.

++How to input special characters

To input the special character, use the navigation up key. There are special characters you can enter as follows.

You need to use Navigation up key and Navigation down key to find desired letters.

++How to input Portuguese/Espanola

To enter **Portuguese/Espanola**, press and hold the desired key among 2key~9key. For example, press and hold 2key to find letter .

++How to move cursor using Keys

Navigation-up key: To enter special characters

Navigation-down key: A capital letter A small letter

Or Navigation-right key: Moves cursor forward

Navigation-left key: Moves cursor backward

BASIC OPERATIONS

+Making And Ending Calls

Before you can make and receive calls, you need to turn "on" the phone and be within range of a network.

- In standby mode, key in the area code and phone and phone number. If you make a mistake, press Key.
- 2. Press **Key** and wait for the answer.
- 3. Press key to finish the call (or close the flip).

TIP: Redialing Last Outgoing Number - In standby mode, press Kev.



Note: If you have set Auto Retry option to "On" (Skey (MENU)+9 key +1key) and if the call does not connect, then the phone automatically retries to make the call.

+Receiving Calls

When somebody is calling you, the phone rings and flashes its light, and a related test is displayed.

To answer an incoming call,

- 1. Extend the antenna completely for best performance.
- 2. To receive an incoming call, you can either flip open the phone or press the side scroll up and down key, voice memo key to receive the call.

If the phone is already open, press any key (except for the soft right key, soft left key, navigation key, end/power key) to receive calls.

3. If you touch the antenna in the conversation, your phone s call quality is fallen off.

++Ringer Silenced

Before the answer the incoming call, if the flip was closed, press $\bigcirc_{\mathbf{kev}}$.



If the flip was opened, press kev.



After "Ringer Silenced", you answer an incoming call as normal.

++Etiquette Mode

You can switch your phone to etiquette mode by pressing key for a while. Press and

hold the **key** until the vibration icon appears and "Switching to Etiquette Mode" display appears. Your phone is switched to the etiquette mode immediately.

Press and hold **#0** key for a whole again to return to terminate the Etiquette Mode.

+Emergency Dialing

Even if your phone is locked, you can place Emergency Dialing.

1. There is (are) different pre-defined emergency number(s) for each country saved in your phone.

- 2. And you can save and edit 5 emergency numbers in you. (Menu-2-7)
- 3. Dialing emergency number you saved: #+Emergency call address (1~5)+send.

USING VARIABLE FUNCTIONS


+Making Calls From a Phone Book

You can save the phone numbers called regularly in memory, called the Phone Book. Each memory location allows storing up to four phone numbers and one E-mail address under one person's name. You then simply recall the number to dial. Your phone can store up to 190 names and numbers.

There are several ways to access up to 190 numbers in your Phone Book Menu. Follow the steps outlined in the sections blow.

++Creating an Add entry; To Save Numbers To Your Phone Book

1. In idle mode, enter the phone number you want to store and then press the STO] key.



- 3. Enter phone number.
- 4. Press Key [STO].

++Editing an Existing Phone Book Entry:

- 1. Select the entry you wish to edit (Use search option)
- 2. Highlight the feature you want to edit and press key [EDIT].
- 3. Follow the phone's intuitive prompts.
- 4. You can edit name, phone number, E-mail, turbo dial, Voice dial, Group, Ring tone.NOTE: Ring tone Each Entry can have different sound if Network supports Caller ID.

++Reviewing all memory location

- 1. In stand-by mode, Press key +2+1 key in the idle mode.
- 2. You can review all numbers stored in your Phone Book in memorial order.
- 3. Use your Navigation Key to scroll through the Phone Book entry list.
- 4. Press **key** to dial the stored number.

++Storing an Emergency Number

This menu provides the option of storing five emergency numbers.

- 1.In stand-by mode, Press the key+2+7key.
- 2.Enter an emergency number if you want to store.
- 3.Press soft right key.

NOTE: You can make an emergency call like this in stand -by mode. (Press # + Emergency

location (1~5)+ key.)

++Current Memory Status

You can check the Memory Status in your phone.

In stand-by mode, Enter the key+2+8key

++Storing the International Telephone Number

You can save International Call Service number you liked.

In stand-by mode, Press key + 2 + 9key.
 Enter Number you want to store.
 When you are making an international call, press and hold key then you can see the stored prefix of International Call Service number at the LCD, and press rests of the number

(country number, local number, and personal number) and key.

++Indicating My Phone Book Number

You can see your own phone number.

In stand-by mode, Press key +2+# key or soft left key+ #.

++Finding a number using a person's name

- 1. Press key+2+2 key in the idle mode.
- 2. Press the name of the person you are looking for and then the screen shows the number of the name stored in the Phone Book. Even if enter the first letter of the name, the screen shows the name such as "Gi" for "Giga", "G T" for "Giga telecom" and "G T I' for "Giga telecom Inc".
- 3. Enter the desired name.
- 4. Press **key** to dial the stored number.

++Finding the name using Navigation Key

- 1. Press $\bigcirc_{\mathbf{key}}$ +2+3 key in the idle mode then enter memory location and press $\bigcirc_{[\mathsf{OK}]}$ key.
- 2. The screen shows the entries stored in the Phone Book in memorial order.
- 3. Use the **navigation key** to find the desired memory and press **key**.
- 4. Press **key** to dial the stored number.

++Finding a number using phone number (if you know at least one digit)

1. Press key + 2+4 key in the idle mode, and then enter phone number and press

⊘key.

2. The screen shows the entries stored in the Phone Book in numerical order if press one

digit you know and then press ok.

3. Enter the desired number and press **kev**.



5. Press **key** to dial the stored number.

++Tip: Quick search

In stand-by mode,

1. Searching by Memory location: Press the desired memory location address (1~190)

+ (a) [ADDR].

2. Searching by Phone number: Press the phone numbers (more than191) and

press [SRCH].

+Using Speed Dialing

Once you have stored phone numbers in the phone book memory, you can dial them easily whenever you want. This feature gives you just one- touch access to numbers stored in the first nine memory locations, 01-09. (Two-touch access to memory location, 10-99: Three touch access to memory location, 100-190)

For example, press and hold a key, 01 through 09, and your call is placed.

Note: If two or more telephone numbers are stored in the same address, the Turbo Number will be dialed at first.

++Abbreviated Dialing (One -Touch Dial)

Memory locations 01 through 09 are special one-touch locations. You can dial the phone numbers stored in the Phone Book memory from 01 through 09 simply by pressing the corresponding button.

For example: Location no. 008

Press and hold 8key.

Or Press 8key and send key.

The number (and name) stored is displayed and then dialed.

++Two - Touch Dial

You can dial the phone numbers stored in the Phone Book memory from 10 through 99 simply by pressing on two buttons.

Press the second digit briefly and then hold down the third digit of the phone book memory.

For example: Location no. 018

Press 1key briefly and hold down 8key. Or Press 1key + 8key + Skey

The stored number (and name) is displayed and then dialed.

++Three - Touch Dial

You can dial the phone numbers stored in the Phone Book memory from 100 through 199 simply by pressing on three buttons.

Press the first and the second digit briefly, then hold down the third digit of the phone book.


For example: Location no. 123

Press 1 key and 2 key briefly and then hold down 3 key.

The number (and name) stored is displayed and then dialed.

+Voice Dialing

You can call up to 20 stored entries by calling the name. Using the voice dial option requires that you first make the phone to recognize the name of the person who you are calling.



- 1. First, flip open
- 2. Press **key**
- 3. After prompt, say a saved voice tag that you want to call.

++Note:

+Missed Call Notification:

If you are unable to answer a call for any reason, you can find out who was calling you by viewing Missed Call service. This way, you can call the person back simply by pressing



The number of time missed calls is displayed on the idle screen immediately after the call was missed. Press O[OK] key back to the stand-by state.

When this network service is activated, you can see the missed call number in the incoming call list

+Auto Machine (Automatic Answering Mode)

If you have set Automatic Answering option to "On" ([MENU] key-9-7key-Auto machine) and the call connects automatic answering mode. Also, if you press and hold



key, Automatic Answering is set.

IN-CALL OPTIONS

Your phone provides a number of functions that you can use during a call. You may not utilize all of these functions at all times. Many of the in-call options depend on network services.

Press key during a call to access the following

+Sending My Phone Number


Your Phone can send DTMF tones of your number to communicate with answering machines, computerized telephony service etc.

Make a call in the normal way. Press [MENU] key and Press 1 key.

+Number Memo

- 1. During a call (MENU) and Press 2 key
- 2. Press the number to store and press [ADD] After call, you can see the number memo at the outgoing call list (MENU-1-2)

+Mute / Un-mute



Example: If you wish to say something to another person in the room but do not want the calling party to hear you.

Tip: Press Navigation up key to Quick Mute/Un-mute

+Phone Book

You can access the Phone Book menu.

+Indicating My Phone Number

+Call Waiting

text notification is displayed.

NOTE: You need to ask how to use Call Waiting Service because it depends on each

individual carrier.

+Three-Way Calling

This feature enables you to conduct conference calls with two separate parties at the same

time.

You are billed airtime for each outgoing call separately.

Contact your service provider to activate Three-Way Calling.

NOTE: You need to ask how to use Call Waiting Service because it depends on each

individual carrier.

+Using Caller ID

Caller ID makes you know who's calling through displaying the number that the person is

calling when your phone rings. If the caller's name and number are already stored in your

Phone Book, the corresponding name appears with the number.

Contact your service provider to activate Using Caller ID

VOICE MAIL AND SHORT MESSAGE SERVICES (SMS)

+About Short Message indicators

You can see these indicators in Short message menu. (Navigation-down key-2)

🖾 : Appears after you check your message.

: Appears when you received it by pagers.

: Appears when your message is locked. If the message is locked, you can 't

clear it.

+Knowing When You Have Messages

If your system supplier provides this service, your phone has the function to receive voicemail notification and text messaging service, which is displayed in your LCD.

When the phone receives a message, an alert tone sounds and a text notification is displayed on the LCD.

If the message memory is full, you have to clear existing messages to receive new messages.

Or

If you don't want to receive additional new messages, you can set this option to instantly delete all incoming messages:

Press Navigation-Down key+5+4.

+Receiving Messages

Either an alert tone will sound once, once every 2 minutes, or the lamp will blink when a message is incoming. And you will see $\ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \ \$ icon.

You can choose your phone alert. For Incoming Alert option, press **Navigation-down key+5+1**.

If you set the contents mode in the display mode option (Navigation-down key+5+2), you can check a new message with Navigation-down key at once.

+Checking Voice Messages

When you receive a voice message, the screen displays the time, date and the number of new, unheard messages. And you will see icon.

If you want to listen to your messages, dial your access number.

Press Navigation-down key+1+ to call your voice message box. If the message includes a call back number, you can call that number in this menu.

And then follow the voice guidance of your service center.

+++Incoming Alert

Cir received: You can set it to clear the oldest message, when the new message arriving time, if the message memory is full.

Or

Rej received: If you want to reject every incoming new message, you can set this option.

+++UP Browser

Your phone comes equipped with a WAP (Wireless Application Protocol) Browser, making it possible for you to access the Wireless Web.

Press Navigation-Down key+6

Before using the WAP Browser, you must set the parameters for the proxy server used by your service provider.

When you turn your phone on, you are asked if you wish to use the phone or access the Internet. The soft keys may vary, depending on your service provider

+Managing Calls History

You will find your recent call history list. This is a list of last 20 phone numbers for call you placed and 20 phone calls you received. The call history list makes redialing a number fast and easy. It is continually updated as new numbers are added to the beginning of the list and the oldest entries are removed from bottom of the list.

++Incoming

This function depends on Caller ID service by your network provider.

This option lets you view the received calls.

SCHEDULE

+Personal Note

To write or edit a personal note (up to 16 personal notes), proceed as follows.

+Reset Phone

Resetting you Phone will restore all the factory defaults. Once you select this feature, the reset process cannot be canceled or reversed.

VOICE SERVICE

You can make phone calls up to 20 stored entries by saying a voice tag that has been added

to a desired name and phone number. Any spoken word, for example a name, can be a voice tag.

+Automatic Answer

This function answers an incoming call automatically after a number of rings that the user sets.

Before using this option, you can set the Speaker "on" to "call screen menu". Press

[MENU] **key +7+5+3key** for Call Screening. After setting up the "call screen" menu, you can simultaneously hear the voice of the counter party, during the recording of the voice memo

Press [MENU] key+9+7key and select the time of "the phone automatically answers calls" option, then press [SEL] key.

While the message is being played, you can take an incoming call by pressing the



Tip: Press key for a while, Automatic Answer will be On/Off instantly.

++Recording Greeting Message

You must record your own greeting message.

If you always want to use the greeting message of Auto Answer option, you have to record the greeting message three times, each one of Record-8K, Record-EVRC and Record-13K.

Press O[MENU] key+7+5+2key.

However, if full voice memories, Auto Answer doesn't work.

+++You can hear the following instructions:

You must buy Data Service Cable for Data Service at the place where you bought your GDM-100 mobile phone.

Press [MENU] key+8key.

To send or receive data through the phone,

- 1. Service Type: High Internet, Normal Internet, Normal Data,
- 2. Termination Type: You can set this receive call option to voice, modem or fax.

Voice: receives a call.

Modem: receives or sends data

Fax: receives or sends fax.

++NOTE: You must ask your carrier in your county how to use Data Service because Data Service depends on countries.

SET UP

+Auto Retry

Press [MENU] key 9+1key+" Yes".

When the call is not connected, this function retries the call automatically at a set interval or amount or retries.

+Prefix Dial

Press (MENU] key 9+2 key.

If you set to "Yes" then, when you place a call the phone automatically makes prefix dialing.

+Back Light

Press (MENU] key+9+3key.

You can select whether or not the phone uses the LCD backlight. The following options are available.

Flip open: The backlight comes on during you open the flip cover.

This function is to dial in the electronic system for using the Audio Response System (ARS) provided by bank or Beep Call. The pausing character (**P** for hard Pause or **T** for time pause) is inserted in the middle of the appropriated phone number enabling transmission after one

second for the number following the time pausing character or by pressing the key only, if it is hard pause.

1. Press **Navigation-right and down key** you can select P. for the use of P (Pause). The "P" is displayed on the screen.

Pause: For the number following P, transmission is possible by pressing the



- 2. For the use of the Time pause (T), press **Navigation-left and up key** you can see the "T" Time pause: It takes 3 seconds for each "T" to transmission following numbers
- 3. Press Navigation-right and down key two times, you can select H (Hyphen: -)
- 4. Press **Navigation-right and down key** three times, you can select N. My phone number is displayed on the screen.

++ Prefix Dialing

Prefix Dialing allows you to alter a phone number in your phonebook by adding additional numbers. For example, if your phonebook entry was entered without an area code and you are out of town, you can prefix that entry with the appropriate area code.

- 1. Select the phonebook entry or call history using one of the previously described methods.
- 2. Select the phone number label of the person you want to call.
- 3. Add additional numbers.
- 4. Press key.

Also, you can use this prefix dialing option while you check your SMS.

+Auto Answer Setting

Press O[MENU] key+9 +7key.

To set "automation answering" option

- -Disable: Not use this option
- -1ring after (5sec. After): You can answer an incoming call automatically after 1ring sounded.
- -3rings after (10sec. After): You can answer an incoming call automatically after 3ring sounded.
- -5rings after (15sec. After): You can answer an incoming call automatically after 5ring sounded.

Auto Machine: You can use Auto Answering Machine

Tip: The time in the round brackets above means when vibration mode or lamp mode is set to on.

+Language

Press [MENU] key+9+8 key.

You can select the language of voice prompts, menus and key-input.

+Contrast

Press (MENU] key+9+9key.

You can adjust the brightness of the LCD by using level 9 indicators.

+Select System

Press [MENU] key+9+#key.

In this option, you can select the system service mode and NAM.

++Force mode

Press (MENU] key+9+#+1key.

You can select the system service mode between CDMA and Analog. Each service mode allows you to select a roaming option. Roaming is a feature, which is only applicable in areas

where there are at least two cellular service providers having valid roaming agreements.

Roaming, when available, allows you to register your phone on one of the networks, but use the facilities of the other if your own network is not available. This system priority feature allows you to program your phone for optimum operation when within your home service area or when outside your home service area.

Contact your home cellular service provider for information on the availability of this feature and roaming agreements they have with other cellular service providers.

++Select system

Press O[MENU] key+9+#+2key.

There are four different roaming options:

Home Only: the phone uses your home network only.

Standard: the phone uses Standard network.

A Only: the phone uses A system only.

B Only: the phone uses B system only.

++Set Auto NAM

Press [MENU] key+9+#+3key.

If you set to **On** this option, the phone selects the networks automatically based on system information for the area you are in.

++Select NAM

Press O[MENU] key+9+#+4key.

The NAM (Number Assignment Module) enables you to subscribe to one or more service networks.

You set the phone to the network you want to use. You can select a NAM from two NAMs.

GAMES

The phone allows you to take time out to enjoy a game.

+Game Start

Allow you to start game.

+Game Level

Allow you to select the level of difficulty. Press [MENU] key+*+2key

Select the required level among 10 levels using the up and down keys.

And press the SEL] **key** to select.

+How to Play

The object of the game is to change the opponent's pieces into my pieces. (→ If you have more pieces than opponent's pieces, you win the game.)

Blocking each end of the opponent's pieces (>White) can do this (vertically, horizontally, or diagonally), which will change all the opponent's pieces (>White) blocked inside into your pieces (>black). Your game will continue until there is no place to change the opponent's pieces into my pieces.

++Keys used in the game:

Up - Number Key '2' or Soft Navigation Key 'Up'

To end the game - Asterisk Key '*' + End Key or just End Key

++How to calculate the score:

Each piece is counted as a point. Therefore, the total numbers of my pieces are my total score.
