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

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
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Introducing your mobile phone

Phone layout





Confirm key

Select the highlighted menu option or confirm an input; In Idle mode, access the message inbox Depending on your service provider or region, the key may perform differently



Application switch key

Open the application switch window to access other applications without exiting the current application



Dial key

Make or answer a call; In Idle mode, retrieve logs of your calls and messages



Voice mail service key In Idle mode, access voice mails (press and hold)



Softkeys

Perform actions indicated at the bottom of the display



4-way navigation key Scroll through menu options:

In Idle mode, access userdefined menus Depending on your service provider, pre-defined menus may differ



Camera key

In Idle mode, turn on the camera: In Camera mode, take a photo or record a video



Power/End key

Turn the phone on or off (press and hold): End a call: In Menu mode, cancel input and return to Idle mode



Alphanumeric kevs



Silent profile key

In Idle mode, activate or deactivate the silent profile (press and hold)



Assembling and preparing your mobile phone


Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the SIM or USIM card and battery

1. Remove the back cover and insert the SIM card.



2. Insert the battery and replace the back cover.



Charge the battery

- 1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the right side of the phone.
- Plug the small end of the supplied travel adapter into the multifunction jack.



- Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- When charging is finished, unplug the travel adapter.
- 1

Do not remove the battery before removing the travel adapter. Doing this may cause damage to the phone.



To save energy, unplug the travel adapter when not in use. The travel adapter does not have a power switch, so you must unplug the travel adapter from the outlet to interrupt the power supply. The travel adapter should remain close to the socket when in use.

Insert a memory card (optional)

Your phone accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards up to 16 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



- Formatting the memory card on a PC may cause incompatibility with your phone. Format the memory card only on the phone.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data will shorten the lifespan of memory cards.
- Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the left side of the phone.
- Insert a memory card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.



3. Replace the back cover.

Using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on or off

To turn your phone on,

- Press and hold [].
- Enter your PIN and press < Confirm> (if necessary).
- When the setup wizard opens, customise your phone as desired by following the screen.

To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- In Idle mode, press < Menu> to access Menu mode.
- Use the Navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.
- Press <Select>, <Save>, or the Confirm key to confirm the highlighted option.

Press <Back> to move up one level; Press [¬¬]
 to return to Idle mode.



- When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM card.
 For details, contact your service provider.

Use the shortcuts toolbar

Use the icons on the toolbar to access popular menus.

To access a menu

- 1. In Idle mode, scroll left or right to select a menu.
- Press the Confirm key to open the menu you want.

To customise the toolbar

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Main display → Shortcuts toolbar.
- Press < Options > → Edit.

- 3. Select the menu you want.
 - Press <**Options** $> \rightarrow$ **Open** to select submenus (if necessary).
- 4. Press <Save>, or press <Options> → Save.

To deactivate the toolbar

In Menu mode, select Settings o Display and light o Main display o Home screen o Shortcuts toolbar o Off.

Switch applications

- While using a menu, press [□].
- Scroll to an application and press <Select>.
- To close all applications, press [☐], scroll to End all?, press <Yes>.

Customise your phone

To switch to or from the silent profile

In Idle mode, press and hold [#] to silence or unsilence your phone.

To set the sound profile

To switch to sound profile,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Select a profile you want.

To edit a sound profile,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- Scroll to a sound profile and press < Options > → Edit.
- 3. Customise the sound settings as desired.

To set menu shortcuts

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone settings → Shortcuts.
- 2. Select a key to use as a shortcut.
- Select a menu and press <Save> to assign to the shortcut key.

Use basic call functions

To make a call

In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.

- 2. Press [] to dial the number.
 - 3. To end the call, press [].

To answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [-].
- To end the call, press [].

To adjust the volume of voice during a call

While a call is in progress, press the Navigation key up or down to adjust the volume.

To use the speakerphone feature

- 1. During a call, press the Confirm key to activate the speaker.
- To switch back to the speaker, press the Confirm key again.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.

To use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

 To redial the last call, press and hold the headset button

- · To answer a call, press the headset button.
- · To end a call, press the headset button.

Send and view messages

To send a text or multimedia message

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create message → Message.
- 2. Enter a recipient number and scroll down.
- Enter your message text. ▶ p. 22
 For sending as a text message, skip to step 5.
 For attaching multimedia, continue with step 4.
- Press < Options> → Add multimedia and add an item.
- 5. Press the Confirm key to send the message.

To view text or multimedia messages

- 1. In Menu mode, select $Messages \rightarrow Inbox$.
- Select a text or multimedia message.

Send and view emails

To send an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create message → Email.
- 2. Enter your message text and scroll up.
- Press < Options> → Attach multimedia and add an item (if necessary).
- 4. Enter a subject and scroll up.
- 5. Enter an email address.
- 6. Press the Confirm key to send the message.



You can send e-cards from the website that is preset by your service provider. In Menu mode, select $\textbf{Messages} \rightarrow \textbf{Create message} \rightarrow \textbf{Send-A-Card}.$

To view an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Email inbox.
- Press <Options> → Download.
- 3. Select an email or a header.

Enter text

You can enter text by pressing keys on the keypad.



Available text input modes may vary depending on your region.

To change the text input mode

- Press and hold [*] to switch between T9 and ABC modes.
- Press [*] to change case or switch to Number mode.
- · Press and hold [#] to switch to Symbol mode.

T9 mode

- Press appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word.
- When the word displays correctly, press [#] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, select an alternate word from the list that appears.

ABC mode

Press an appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.

Number mode

Press an appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number.

Symbol mode

Press an appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a symbol.

To use other features for text input

- · To move the cursor, press the Navigation key.
- To delete characters one by one, press <Clear>.
 To delete entire words, press and hold <Clear>.
- To enter punctuation marks, press [1].

Add and find contacts



The memory location to save new contacts may be preset depending on your service provider. To change the memory location, in Menu mode, select $\label{eq:proposed_proposed_proposed_proposed} \textbf{Phonebook} \rightarrow \textbf{Spttings} \rightarrow \textbf{Save}$ $\textbf{new contacts to} \rightarrow \textbf{a} \text{ memory location}.$

To add a new contact

- In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press
 Options> → Add to Phonebook.
- Select a memory location (if necessary) → New.

- 3. Select a number type (if necessary).
- 4. Enter contact information.
- 5. Press the Confirm key or press **Options** \rightarrow **Save** to add the contact to memory.

To find a contact

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find.
- 3. Select the contact's name from the contact list.

Use basic camera functions

To capture photos

- 1. In Idle mode, press [1] to turn on the camera.
- Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- Press the Confirm key or [[♠]] to take a photo.
 The photo is saved automatically.

To view photos

In Menu mode, select My files \rightarrow Images \rightarrow My photos \rightarrow a photo file.

To capture videos

- 1. In Idle mode, press [6] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Press [1] twice to switch to Recording mode.
- Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 4. Press the Confirm key or [1] to start recording.
- Press the Confirm key or [o] to stop recording.
 The video is saved automatically.

To view videos

In Menu mode, select My files \rightarrow Videos \rightarrow My video clips \rightarrow a video file.

Listen to music

To listen to the FM radio

- 1. Plug the supplied headset into the phone.
- In Menu mode, select Applications → FM radio.
- Press < Yes> to start automatic tuning.
 The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.



The first time you turn on the FM radio, you will be prompted to start automatic tuning.

Control the FM radio using the following keys:

Key	Function
Confirm	Turn the FM radio on or off
Navigation	Left/Right: Fine-tune the frequency; Search for an available radio station (press and hold)
	Up/Down: Select a saved radio station
Volume	Adjust the volume

To listen to music files

Start by transferring files to your phone or memory card:

- Download from the wireless web. ▶ p. 28
- Download from a PC with the optional Samsung PC Studio. ▶ p. 40
- Receive via Bluetooth. ▶ p. 44
- Copy to your memory card. ▶ p. 41
- Synchronise with Windows Media Player 11. ► p. 40

After transferring music files to your phone or memory card,

- 1. In Menu mode, select Music → Music player.
- 2. Select a music category \rightarrow a music file.
- 3. Control playback using the following keys:

Navigation	Left: Restart playback; Skip backward (press within 2 seconds); Scan backward in a file (press and hold)
	Right: Skip forward; Scan forward in a file (press and hold)

3	Activate Shuffle mode
4	Change the repeat mode
5	Select a skin type

Browse the web



The web browser menu may be labelled differently depending on your service provider.

To browse web pages

- In Menu mode, select BigPond → Home to launch your service provider's homepage.
- 2. Navigate web pages using the following keys:

Key	Function
Navigation	Scroll through on a web page
Confirm	Select an item
<back></back>	Return to the previous page
<options></options>	Access a list of browser options

To bookmark your favourite web pages

- 1. In Menu mode, select $\textbf{BigPond} \rightarrow \textbf{Bookmarks}.$
- 2. Press <Options> → Add bookmark.
- Enter a page title and a web address (URL) and press the Confirm key or <Save>.

Use the web services

To download games and media files from the web

- In Menu mode, select Applications → BigPond Apps.
- 2. Select a category.
- Search for and download items to the phone as you want.

To access community websites

- In Menu mode, select Applications → Communities.
- 2. Select a website you want to access.
- 3. Enter your user name and password and sign in.
- Share photos, videos, or messages with friends and family.

To access web services preset by your service provider

- 1. In Menu mode, select My Place.
- 2. Select a service you want to use.

Using advanced functions

Learn how to perform advanced operations and use additional features of your mobile phone.

Use advanced call functions

To view and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call,

- 1. Press <View>.
- 2. Scroll to the missed call you want to dial.
- 3. Press [] to dial.

To call a recently dialled number

- In Idle mode, press [] to display a list of recent numbers.
- Scroll to the number you want and press [-] to dial.

To hold a call or retrieve a held call

Press < Hold> to place a call on hold or press < Retrieve> to retrieve a held call.

To dial a second call

If your network supports this function, you can dial another number during a call:

- 1. Press < Hold> to place the first call on hold.
- Enter the second number to dial and press [-].
- 3. Press <Swap> to switch between the two calls.

To answer a second call

If your network supports this function, you can answer a second incoming call:

- Press [] to answer the second call.
 The first call is automatically placed on hold.
- 2. Press <Swap> to switch between the calls.

To make a multiparty call (conference call)

- Call the first party you want to add to the multiparty call.
- While connected to the first party, call the second party.
 - The first party is automatically placed on hold.
- When connected to the second party, press
 Options> → Conference call.

To call an international number

- In Idle mode, press and hold [0] to insert the + character.
- Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then press [—] to dial.

To call a contact from the phonebook

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Scroll to the number you want to dial and press [] to dial.

To reject a call

To reject an incoming call, press [----]. The caller will hear a busy tone.

To reject calls from certain numbers automatically, use the auto rejection. To activate the auto rejection and set up the reject list,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Application settings → Call → All calls → Auto reject.
- 2. Scroll left or right to On.
- Select Reject list.
- 4. Press < Options > \rightarrow Create.

- 5. Enter a number to reject and press the Confirm key.
- 6. To add more numbers, repeat steps 4-5.
- 7. Select the numbers you want to reject.
- Press < Options> → Save.
- Press < Save>.

Use advanced phonebook functions

To create your namecard

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- Press <Options> → My business card.
- 3. Enter your personal details.
- Press the Confirm key or press < Options> → Save.

To set speed dial numbers

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- Scroll to a contact to assign to a speed dial number.
- Press <Options> → Add to speed dial.
- Select a number you want to set.The contact is saved to the speed dial number.

To create a group of contacts

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- Scroll left or right to Groups.
- Press <Options> → Create group → a memory location (if necessary).
- 4. Enter a group name and press <Save>.
- Press <Options> → Group settings.
- Select Group ID → an image category → an image.
- Select Ringtone → a ringtone category → a ringtone.
- Press < Options> → Save.

Use advanced messaging functions

To create a text template

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Templates
 → Text templates.
- Press < Create > to open a new template window.
- Enter your text and press the Confirm key to save the template.

To create a multimedia template

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Templates** → **Multimedia templates**.
- 2. Press < Create > to open a new template window.
- Create a multimedia message, with a subject and desired attachments, to use as your template.
 - ▶ p. 20
- Press <Options> → Save as template.

Use advanced camera functions

To capture a photo in Smile shot mode

- 1. In Idle mode, press [1] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Press <≣> → Shooting mode → Smile shot → <≦>.
- Make any necessary adjustments.
- 4. Press the Confirm key or [].
- Aim the camera lens at your subject. Your phone recognises people in an image and detects their smiles. When the subject smiles, the phone automatically takes a photo.

To capture a series of photos

- 1. In Idle mode, press [েন্টা] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Press <**⋽**> → **Shooting mode** → **Continuous** → <**⋽**>.
- Make any necessary adjustments.
- Press and hold the Confirm key or [o] take a series of photos.

To capture a panoramic photo

- 1. In Idle mode, press [1] to turn on the camera.
- Press < ⇒ > → Shooting mode → Panorama.
- 3. Select the number of photos.
- Make any necessary adjustments.
- 5. Press the Confirm key or [151] take the first photo.
- Slowly move the phone to the right. The phone captures the next photo automatically.
- 7. Repeat step 6 to complete the panoramic photo.

To capture divided photos

- 1. In Idle mode, press [] to turn on the camera.
- Press <≡> → Shooting mode → Mosaic.
- Scroll left or right to an image layout and press the Confirm key.
- 4. Make any necessary adjustments.
- Press the Confirm key or [ô] take photos for each segment.

To capture photos with decorative frames

- 1. In Idle mode, press [1] to turn on the camera.
- Press < > → Shooting mode → Frame → < >.
- Scroll left or right to a frame and press the Confirm key.
- Make any necessary adjustments.
- Press the Confirm key or [o] to take a photo with the frame.

To use camera options

Before capturing a photo, press <≣> to access the following options:

Option	Function
Shooting mode	Change the shooting mode
Resolution	Change the resolution option
White balance	Adjust the colour balance
Effects	Apply a special effect
Night mode	Set whether to use Night shot mode
Exposure metering	Select a type of exposure metre

Before recording a video, press \le to access the following options:

Recording mode	Change the recording mode
Resolution	Change the resolution option
White balance	Adjust the colour balance
Effects	Apply a special effect

To customise camera settings

Before capturing a photo, press $\leq \equiv > \rightarrow$ **Settings** to access the following settings:

Option	Function
Photo quality	Set the quality level for your photos
Viewfinder mode	Change the preview screen
Review	Set the camera to display the captured image
Shutter sound	Set the camera shutter to make a sound when capturing a photo
Storage	Select a memory location to store photos
Shortcut info	View the shortcut information

Before recording a video, press $<\overline{\equiv}> \rightarrow$ **Settings** to access the following settings:

Option	Function
Quality	Set the quality level of your videos
Viewfinder mode	Change the preview screen
Audio recording	Turn the audio on or off
Storage	Select a memory location to store video clips
Shortcut info	View the shortcut information

Use advanced music functions

To copy music files via Samsung PC Studio

- In Menu mode, select Settings → PC connections → Samsung PC studio or Mass storage → <Save>.
- Press [To return to the Idle mode (if necessary).
- Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your phone to a PC.
- Run Samsung PC Studio and copy files from the PC to the phone.
 - Refer to the Samsung PC Studio help for more information.



To transfer data from a PC to your phone, you need Windows XP Service Pack 2.

To synchronise your phone with Windows Media Player

- In Menu mode, select Settings → PC connections → Media player → <Save>.
- Press [to return to the Idle mode (if necessary).

- Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your phone to a PC with Windows Media Player installed.
 - When connected, a pop-up window will appear on the PC.
- Open Windows Media Player to synchronise music files.
- Edit or enter your phone's name in the pop-up window (if necessary).
- Select and drag the music files you want to the sync list.
- 7. Start synchronisation.

To copy music files to a memory card

- 1. Insert a memory card.
- In Menu mode, select Settings → PC connections → Mass storage → <Save>.
- Press [To] to return to the Idle mode (if necessary).
- Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your phone to a PC.
 When connected, a pop-up window will appear on the PC.
- 5. Open a folder to view files.
- Copy files from the PC to the memory card.

To create a playlist

- In Menu mode, select Music → Music player → Playlists.
- Select Create playlist.
- Enter a title for your new playlist and press <Save>.
- 4. Select the new playlist.
- Select Add tracks.
- Select the files you want to include and press <OK>.

To customise your music player settings

- 1. In Menu mode, select Music → Music player.
- Press < Options> → Player settings.
- Adjust the settings to customise your music player.
- Press < Save >.

To find information of music

- In Menu mode, select Music → Find music.
- 2 Select Find music to connect to the server
- When the phone is successfully registered, press <Record> to record a part of music you want to find.



Some service providers may not support this service and the database may not have information for all songs.

To set up your favourite station list

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Applications** → **FM radio**.
- Press the Confirm key to start the FM radio.
- Select a radio station to add to the favourite station list.
- Press < Options> → Add to Favourites.

Using tools and applications

Learn how to work with your mobile phone's tools and additional applications.

Use the Bluetooth wireless feature

To turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature

- In Menu mode, select Applications → Bluetooth
- Press < Options> → Settings.
- 3. Scroll down to Activation.
- 4. Scroll left or right to On.
- 5. To allow other devices to locate your phone, select My phone's visibility → Visible → <OK>. If you selected Custom, set duration that your phone is visible.
- Press < Options > → Save.

To find and pair with other Bluetooth-enabled devices

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Applications** → **Bluetooth** → **Search for new devices**.
- 2. Scroll to a device and press <Select>.
- Enter a PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature or the other device's Bluetooth PIN, if it has one, and press <OK>.

When the owner of the other device enters the same code or accepts the connection, pairing is complete.



You may not need to enter a PIN depending on the device.

To send data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

- Select the file or item from one of your phone's applications that you want to send.
- Press <Options> → Send via, Send business card via, or Send URL via → Bluetooth.

To receive data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

- Enter the PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature and press < OK> (if necessary).
- Press < Yes> to confirm that you are willing to receive data from the device (if necessary).

Activate the mobile tracker

When someone inserts a new SIM card in your phone, the mobile tracker feature will automatically send the contact number to specified recipients to help you locate and recover your phone.

To activate the mobile tracker

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Security → Mobile tracker.
- Enter your password and press < Confirm>.



The first time you access Mobile tracker, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.

- 3. Scroll left or right to **On**.
- Scroll down and press the Confirm key to open the recipient list.

Press < Options> → Phonebook to open your contact list.

You can also enter a phone number including a country code (with +).

- 6. Select a contact → a number.
- 7. When you are finished selecting contacts, press the Confirm key to save the recipients.
- 8. Scroll down and enter the sender's name.
- Press the Confirm key → <Accept>.

Activate the mirror feature

You can use the phone's display as a mirror by turning on the front camera.

In Idle mode, press and hold the Volume key up to use the mirror

To deactivate or activate Mirror mode, in Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Phone settings \rightarrow Mirror mode.

Make fake calls

You can simulate an incoming call when you want to get out of meetings or unwanted conversations.

You must set a shortcut key to make a fake call; In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Phone settings** → **Shortcuts** and set a shortcut key for **Fake call**.

To make a fake call, in Idle mode, press and hold the shortcut key.

Record and play voice memos

To record a voice memo

- In Menu mode, select Applications → Voice recorder.
- 2. Press the Confirm key to start recording.
- 3. Speak your memo into the microphone.
- When you are finished speaking, press the Navigation key down.

To play a voice memo

- From the voice recorder screen, press
 Options> → My voice clips.
- 2. Select a file.

Use Java-powered games and applications

- In Menu mode, select Applications → Games and more.
- Select a game or application from the list and follow the on-screen instructions.



Available games may vary depending on your service provider or region. Game controls and options may vary.

Synchronise data

To create a synchronisation profile

- In Menu mode, select Applications → Synchronise.
- Press <Add> and specify profile parameters.
- When you are finished, press <Save>.

To start synchronisation

- In Menu mode, select Applications → Synchronise.
- 2. Select a synchronisation profile.
- Press **Continue**> to start synchronisation with the web server you have specified.

Use the RSS reader

To add an RSS feed address

- In Menu mode, select Applications → RSS reader.
- Press < Options > → Add.
- Enter the address of an RSS feed and press <OK>.

To update and read RSS feeds

- In Menu mode, select Applications → RSS reader.
- Press < Options > → Update → an option.
- 3. Press < Yes > to get the updated feed.

Create a world clock

- In Menu mode, select Organiser → World clock.
- Press < Options > → Add.
- 3. Scroll left or right to a time zone.
- To set daylight saving time, scroll down and press the Confirm key.

- Press <Save> to create the world clock.The world clock is set as the second clock.
- 6. To add more world clocks, repeat steps 2-5.

Set and use alarms

Learn to set and control alarms for important events.

To set a new alarm

- 1. In Menu mode, select Alarms.
- 2. Select an empty alarm location.
- Set the details of the alarm.
- Press < Options > → < Save >.

To stop an alarm

When the alarm sounds,

- Press <OK> or the Confirm key to stop the alarm.
- Press <Snooze> to silence the alarm for the snooze period.

- When the timer expires, press <OK> to stop the alert.

Use the stopwatch

- In Menu mode, select Applications → Stopwatch.
- Press the Confirm key to begin the stopwatch.

Create new tasks

- 3. Enter your memo text and press the Confirm key.

Manage your calendar

To change the calendar view

- 1. In Menu mode, select Organiser → Calendar.
- Press <Options> → View by → Day, Week, or Month.

To create an event

- 1. In Menu mode, select $Organiser \rightarrow Calendar$.
- 2. Press **Options** → **Create** → an event type.
- 3. Enter the details of the event as required.
- Press < Options> → < Save>.

To view events

- 1. In Menu mode, select $Organiser \rightarrow Calendar$.
- 2. Select a date on the calendar.
- 3. Select an event to view its details.

Troubleshooting

When you turn on your phone or while you are using the phone, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
Password	When the phone lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the phone.
PIN	When using the phone for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM card. You can disable this feature by using the PIN lock menu.
PUK	Your SIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.
PIN2	When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

Your phone displays network or service error messages

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

Calls are being dropped

When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose your connection to the network. Move to another area and try again.

Outgoing calls are not connected

- · Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number you are dialling.

Incoming calls are not connected

- · Ensure that your phone is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the incoming phone number.

Others cannot hear you speaking on a call

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

Audio quality is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

When dialling from contacts, the call is not connected

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list
- · Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the contact's phone number.

The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

The battery does not charge properly or the phone turns off

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both gold-coloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery (refer to your local ordinances for proper disposal instructions).

Your phone is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your phone for an extended period of time, your phone may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.

Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your Samsung mobile phone must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery or replace it with a battery that is fully charged.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your phone.
- Restart the phone. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

Error messages appear when launching the FM radio

The FM radio application on your Samsung mobile device uses the headset cable as an antenna. Without a headset connected, the FM radio will be unable to receive radio stations. To use the FM radio, first ensure that the headset is properly connected. Next, scan for and save the available radio stations.

If you still cannot use the FM radio after performing these steps, try accessing your desired station with another radio receiver. If you can hear the station with another receiver, your device may require service. Contact a Samsung Service Centre.

Error messages appear when opening music files

Some music files may not play on your Samsung mobile phone for a variety of reasons. If you receive error messages when opening music files on your phone, try the following:

- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your phone.
- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights
 Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRMprotected, ensure that you have the appropriate
 license or key to play the file.
- · Ensure that your phone supports the file type.

Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on your phone.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on the device you wish to connect to, if necessary.
- Ensure that your phone and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 m).

If the tips above do not solve the problem, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

A connection is not established when you connect the phone to a PC

- Ensure that the PC data cable you are using is compatible with your phone.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your PC.

Your phone freezes or has fatal errors

If your phone freezes or hangs, you may need to close programs or reset the device to regain functionality. If your phone is frozen and unresponsive, remove the battery, replace the battery, and turn on the phone.

Safety precautions

To prevent injury to yourself and others or damage to your device, read all of the following information before using your device.

Warning: Prevent electric shock, fire, and explosion

Do not use damaged power cords or plugs, or loose electrical sockets

Do not touch the power cord with wet hands, or disconnect the charger by pulling on the cord

Do not use your device while charging or touch your device with wet hands

Do not short-circuit the charger or the battery

Do not drop or cause an impact to the charger or the battery

Do not charge the battery with chargers that are not approved by the manufacturer

Your device may malfunction and your risk of electric shock is increased.

Do not handle a damaged or leaking Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) battery

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

Do not use your device near a pacemaker

- Avoid using your device within a 15 cm range of a pacemaker if possible, as your device can interfere with the pacemaker.
- If you must use your device, keep at least 15 cm away from the pacemaker.
- To minimise the possible interference with a pacemaker, use your device on the opposite side of your body from the pacemaker.

Do not use your device in a hospital or near medical equipment that can be interfered with by radio frequency

If you personally use any medical equipment, contact the manufacturer of the equipment to ensure the safety of your equipment from radio frequency.

If you are using a hearing aid, contact the manufacturer for information about radio interference

Some hearing aids may be interfered with by the radio frequency of your device. Contact the manufacturer to ensure the safety of your hearing aid.

Turn off the device in potentially explosive environments

- Turn off your device in potentially explosive environments instead of removing the battery.
- Always comply with regulations, instructions and signs in potentially explosive environments.

Turn off your device when in an aircraft

Using your device in an aircraft is illegal. Your device may interfere with the electronic navigation instruments of the aircraft.

Electronic devices in a motor vehicle may malfunction due to the radio frequency of your device

Electronic devices in your car may malfunction due to radio frequency of your device. Contact the manufacturer for more information.

Comply with all safety warnings and regulations regarding mobile device usage while operating a vehicle

While driving, safely operating the vehicle is your first responsibility. Never use your mobile device while driving, if it is prohibited by law. For your safety and the safety of others, practice good common sense and remember the following tips:

- · Use a hands-free device.
- Get to know your device and its convenience features, such as speed dial and redial. These features help you reduce the time needed to place or receive calls on your mobile device.

- Position your device within easy reach. Be able to access your wireless device without removing your eyes from the road. If you receive an incoming call at an inconvenient time, let your voice mail answer if for you.
- Let the person you are speaking with know you are driving.
 Suspend calls in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
 Rain, sleet, snow, ice, and heavy traffic can be hazardous.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers. Jotting down a "to do" list or flipping through your address book takes attention away from your primary responsibility of driving safely.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic. Place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic. Try to plan calls when your car will be stationary. If you need to make a call, dial only a few numbers, check the road and your mirrors, then continue.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting. Make people you are talking with aware you are driving and suspend conversations that have the potential to divert your attention from the road.
- Use your device to call for help. Dial a local emergency number in the case of fire, traffic accident, or medical emergencies.


