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safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Excessive exposure to sound at high volumes can cause hearing damage. Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source and use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries or phones in a fire.
 Follow all local regulations when disposing of used batteries or phones.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

Avoid interference with pacemakers

Maintain a minimum of 15 cm (6 inches) between mobile phones and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

While using your phone, hold the phone with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, use special features that reduce the number of keys you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent breaks.

Do not use the phone if the screen is cracked or broken

Broken glass or acrylic could cause injury to your hand and face. Bring the phone to a Samsung service centre to replace the screen. Damage caused by careless handling will void your manufacturer's warranty.



Drive safely at all times

Avoid using your phone while driving and obey all regulations that restrict the use of mobile phones while driving. Use hands-free accessories to increase your safety when possible.

Follow all safety warnings and regulations

Comply with any regulations that restrict the use of a mobile phone in a certain area.

Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your phone or cause injury.

Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

Your phone can cause interference with aircraft equipment. Follow all airline regulations and turn off your phone or switch to a mode that disables the wireless functions when directed by airline personnel.

Protect batteries and chargers from damage

- Avoid exposing batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0° C/32° F or above 45° C/ 113° F). Extreme temperatures can reduce the charging capacity and life of your batteries.
- Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and - terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- Never use a damaged charger or battery.

Handle your phone carefully and sensibly

• Do not disassemble your phone due to a risk of electric shock.

- Do not allow your phone to get wet—liquids can cause serious damage and will change the colour of the label that indicates water damage inside the phone. Do not handle your phone with wet hands. Water damage to your phone can void your manufacturer's warranty.
- Avoid using or storing your phone in dusty, dirty areas to prevent damage to moving parts.
- Your phone is a complex electronic device protect it from impacts and rough handling to avoid serious damage.
- Do not paint your phone, as paint can clog moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- If your phone has a camera flash or light, avoid using it close to the eyes of children or animals.

 Your phone may be damaged by exposure to magnetic fields. Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic closures or allow your phone to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time.

Avoid interference with other electronic devices

Your phone emits radio frequency (RF) signals that may interfere with unshielded or improperly shielded electronic equipment, such as pacemakers, hearing aids, medical devices, and other electronic devices in homes or vehicles. Consult the manufacturers of your electronic devices to solve any interference problems you experience.



M Important usage information

Use your phone in the normal position

Avoid contact with your phone's internal antenna.

Allow only qualified personnel to service your phone

Allowing unqualified personnel to service your phone may result in damage to your phone and will void your warranty.

Ensure maximum battery and charger life

- Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.
- · Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.

- Disconnect chargers from power sources when not in use.
- Use batteries only for their intended purpose.

Handle UIM cards and memory cards with care

- Do not remove a card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or phone.
- Protect cards from strong shocks, static electricity, and electrical noise from other devices.
- Frequent writing and erasing will shorten the life span of memory cards.
- Do not touch gold-coloured contacts or terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.

Ensure access to emergency services

Emergency calls from your phone may not be possible in some areas or circumstances. Before travelling in remote or undeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) certification information

Your phone conforms to U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) standards that limit human exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy emitted by radio and telecommunications equipment. These standards prevent the sale of mobile phone that exceed a maximum exposure level (known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR) of 1.6 W/kg. In normal use, the actual SAR is likely to be much lower, as the phone has been designed to emit only the RF energy necessary to transmit a signal to the nearest base station. By automatically emitting lower levels when possible, your phone reduces your overall exposure to RF energy.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone based on the compliance of all reported SAR levels with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. The authorisation can be found on the FCC Office of Engineering and Technology website at http://www.fcc.gov/oet/ea.



assembling and preparing your mobile phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the UIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a User Identity Module (UIM) card with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the UIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.





If the phone is on, press and hold [To turn it off.

2. Insert the UIM card.



- Place the UIM card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
- Without inserting a UIM card, you can use your phone's non-network services and some menus.
- You can only use voice call and text message functions with the regular UIM card. To use full network services, insert an OMH card (Ruby marked RUIM card).

3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

- 1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
- 2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- 3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- 4. When the battery is fully charged (the (iiii) icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards up to 8 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



Formatting the memory card on a PC may cause incompatibility with your phone. Format the memory card only on the phone.

- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Insert a memory card with the label side facing up.

- 3. Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.
- 4. Replace the battery cover.

To remove the memory card, push it gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.

Attach a hand strap (optional)

- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Slide a hand strap through the slot and hook it over the small projection.

using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- 1. Press and hold [.
- 2. Enter your PIN and select **OK** (if necessary). To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

Switch to the offline profile

By switching to the offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.

To switch to the offline profile, in Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Phone profiles \rightarrow Offline \rightarrow Save.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Use the touch screen

Your phone's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions. Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.





Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down and adjust the key tone volume.

Adjust the vibration intensity on the touch screen

You can adjust the intensity of the vibration when you tap the phone screen.

- 2. Select Vibration and adjust the intensity of the vibration.

Switch to or from the silent profile

In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and tap and hold **#** to silence or unsilence your phone.

Calibrate the screen

Set time for the auto power

You can set the phone to automatically turn on or off at a specified time to save the battery life.

- 2. Set the time for the phone to turn off.
- 3. Set the time for the phone to turn on.

Lock your phone

- 1. In Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Security.
- 2. Select On under Phone lock.
- 3. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and select OK.

- 4. Enter the new password again and select OK.
 - The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.

Enter text

Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

Capture photos

- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
 - To select the time delay, select 🖏.
 - To adjust brightness, select 🗾.
 - To zoom in or out, press the Volume key.
- Press [1] to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.
 After capturing photos, select → to view photos.

View photos

In Menu mode, select My files \rightarrow Images \rightarrow My photos \rightarrow a photo file.

To categorise and view photos in a wide view,

1. In Menu mode, select Photo browser.

- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- Select → a category to categories the photos.
- 4. Scroll left or right to view photos.

Capture videos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [3] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Select or to switch to Recording mode.
- 4. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
 - To change the recording mode, select 🛅.
 - To select the time delay, select 🖏.
 - To adjust brightness, select 🗾
 - To zoom in or out, press the Volume key.

- 5. Press [6] to start recording.
- Select or press [1] to stop recording. The video is saved automatically.

After capturing videos, select 🕩 to view videos.

View videos

You can play videos recorded at up to 128 kbps with 15 fps at QCIF. Your phone supports files with the following extention and codec:

- File format: 3gp, 3gp2, mp4, midi, pmd
- Audio codec: aac, qcelp, amr-nb
- Video codec: mp4, h.263

Use one of the following methods to view videos.

Listen to music



Use advanced call functions

Learn about your phone's additional calling capabilities.

View and dial missed calls

When you have one missed call, select **Call** from the event alert widget to dial.

When you have two missed calls or more, select **View** from the event alert widget and select $Logs \rightarrow$ a number to dial.

Call a recently dialled number

- In Idle mode, press [-] to display a list of recent numbers.
- 2. Select the number you want and select **C** to dial.

Hold a call or retrieve a held call

Select **Hold** to place a call on hold or select **Retrieve** to retrieve a held call.

Dial a second call

If your network supports this function, you can dial another number during a call:

- 1. Press [-] to place the first call on hold.
- 2. Enter the second number to dial and press [--].
- 3. To end the calls, press [-].

Answer a second call

If your network supports this function, you can answer a second incoming call:

- Press [-] to answer the second call. The first call is automatically placed on hold.
- 2. Press [-] to switch between the calls.

Make a three-way call

- 1. Call the first party you want to add to the threeway call.
- 2. While connected to the first party, call the second party.
- 3. To end the three-way call, press [.



Some service providers may not support this service and you need to subscribe to this service depending on your service provider.

Call an international number

To set an international call prefix,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Application settings → Call → Int'l call prefix.
- 2. Select Add.
- 3. Enter a prefix as desired and select Save.
- 4. Select a prefix in the list and select Save.

To make an international call,

- In Idle mode, select Keypad and touch and hold 0 to insert the + character.
- Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then press [-] to dial.

Call a contact from the phonebook

You can call numbers directly from the phonebook using stored contacts. \blacktriangleright p. 31

- 1. In Idle mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Select the contact you want.
- 3. Select 💟 next to the number you want to dial.

Reject a call

To reject an incoming call, press [". The caller will hear a busy tone.

To reject calls from certain numbers automatically, use the auto rejection. To activate the auto rejection and set up the reject list,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Application settings → Call → All calls → Auto Reject.
- 2. Select On under Activation.
- 3. Select Add to reject list.
- 4. Select tap to add number.
- 5. Enter a number to reject and select **Done** \rightarrow **Save**.
- 6. Select the check box next to the number.
- 7. Select Save.

Use advanced phonebook functions

Learn to create your namecard, set favourite numbers, and create groups of contacts.

Create your namecard

- 1. In Idle mode, select Phonebook \rightarrow More \rightarrow My namecard.
- 2. Enter your personal details.
- 3. Select Save.



You can send your namecard by attaching it to a message or transferring it via the Bluetooth wireless feature.

Set favourite numbers

- 1. In Idle mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Select the **Contacts** drop-down menu and select **Favorites**.

- 3. Select Add.
- 4. Select a contact.

The contact is saved to the favourite number list.



The first 5 favourite numbers will be assigned to the favourite contacts (a) on the widget toolbar.

Create a group of contacts

By creating groups of contacts, you can assign group names, ringtones, and caller ID photos to each group or send messages and emails to an entire group. Start by creating a group:

- 1. In Idle mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Select the **Contacts** drop-down menu and select **Groups**.
- 3. Select New group.

- 4. Set a group name, the caller ID photo, and a group ringtone.
- 5. Select Save.
- 6. Select **Yes** and add members to the group (if necessary).

Copy contacts to a new OMH card

You can copy the contacts saved in your UIM card to your new OMH card.

- 1. Insert the UIM card to the phone.
- 2. In Idle mode, select Phonebook.
- 3. Select More \rightarrow Copy contacts \rightarrow UIM to phone.
- 4. Select contacts you want to move to the phone and select Copy contacts.
- 5. Remove the UIM card and insert the new OMH card.

- 8. Select contacts you want to move to the OMH card and select **Copy contacts**.

- 3. Select \square \rightarrow Multi shot.
- 4. Make any necessary adjustments.
- 5. Press and hold [1] to take a series of photos.

Capture divided photos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [3] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Select $\square \rightarrow$ Mosaic shot.
- 4. Select an image layout.
- 5. Make any necessary adjustments.
- 6. Press [b] to take photos for each segment.

Capture photos with decorative frames

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [6] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Select \square \rightarrow Frame shot.

- 4. Select a frame.
- 5. Make any necessary adjustments.
- 6. Press [1] to take a photo with the frame.

Capture photos by using options preset for various scenes

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [1] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Select Set \rightarrow a scene \rightarrow OK.
- 4. Make any necessary adjustments.
- 5. Press [1] to take a photo.

- Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your phone to a PC with Windows Media Player installed.
 When connected, a pop-up window will appear on the PC.
- 5. Open Windows Media Player to synchronise music files.
- 6. Edit or enter your phone's name in the pop-up window (if necessary).

You can use a variety of additional services offered by your service provider.

In Menu mode, select Air Services \rightarrow UTK.



This menu is available only when you use a UTK UIM card that provides additional services.

Use the Bluetooth wireless feature

Turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature

Use the mobile tracker 2.0

When someone inserts a new UIM card in your phone, the mobile tracker feature will automatically send the contact number to two recipients to help you locate and recover your phone.

Activate the mobile tracker 2.0

- 1. In Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Security \rightarrow Mobile Tracker.
- 2. Enter your phone password and select OK.



- The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.

- 3. Enter the mobile tracker password of the remote phone and select **Done**.

- 6. Enter the contact name on the remote phone and select **Done**.
- 7. Select OK.

To delete data on the remote phone,

- 1. From the Access remote phone screen, select **Delete user data**.
- 2. Select Yes.

A call log list, contacts, and all messages of the remote phone will be deleted.

To forward calls to another phone,

- 1. From the Access remote phone screen, select Call diverting.
- 2. Enter the phone number to which incoming calls of the remote phone will be forwarded.
- 3. Select Activate.

All incoming calls of the remote phone will be forwarded to the new phone number.

To get location information,

From the Access remote phone screen, select **Get** location information.

• An SMS message that contains the location information will come in.



To change the password for the mobile tracker, select Change mobile tracker 2.0 password.

- 3. Speak your memo into the microphone.

Apply effects to images

- 2. Select 🕰.
- Select Edit → Effects → an effect option (filter, style, warp, or partial blur).
- 4. Select a variation of the effect to apply and select **Done**.

To apply a blur effect to a specific area of an image, move and resize the rectangle and select $Blur \rightarrow Done$.

- 5. When you are finished, select File \rightarrow Save as.
- Enter a new file name for the image and select Done → Yes.

Adjust an image

- 1. Open an image to be edited. Refer to steps 1-2 in "Apply effects to images."

troubleshooting

If you are having trouble with your mobile phone, try these troubleshooting procedures before contacting a service professional.

When you turn on your phone or while you are using the phone, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
Password	When the phone lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the phone.
PIN	When using the phone for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the UIM card. You can disable this feature by using the PIN lock menu.

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
PUK	Your UIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.

The phone prompts you to insert the UIM card.

Ensure that the UIM card is installed correctly.

Your phone displays "No service. Currently unavailable." when you make a call.

 When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again. roubleshootin

 You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

You enter a number, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key: [---].
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

Another caller cannot reach you.

- Ensure that your phone is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not activated the auto reject feature.

Another caller cannot hear you speaking.

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes.

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

The audio quality of the call is poor.

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

You select a contact to call, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.

The battery does not charge properly or sometimes the phone turns itself off.

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both gold-coloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery.

Your phone is hot to the touch.

When you use applications that require more power, your phone may heat up.

This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.
