1. Warning



3-2 How to Use the Function Buttons

 $(\swarrow \%)$ These are Soft keys and are used to select the functions displayed on the lower part of LCD screen.

The left soft key button takes charge of commands shown in the left of the screen, and the right soft key takes charge of commands shown on the right of the screen. There is no fixed function assigned to each key since its function differs depending on the commands shown in the screen.

(完 些) Used to move the Menu options, to adjust the volume in the Adjust Volume screen, or to move the cursor in the screen to enter letters or numbers.

- (\mathcal{A}) Used to make a call or to receive an incoming call.
- ()Delete characters from the display.
- $(\int \mathcal{F})$)Used to end a call, to cancel a function, and for Power On/Off.

()Hold it down to enter number with an international access code "+".

(C)Used to convert to vibration mode.

(β [I])Used to adjust the keypad volume whist in standby mode, or to adjust the voice volume when making a call. Used to turn on the external LCD light when the folder is closed.

3-3 Icon Description

- Shows the intensity of the signal with the number of bars.
- Shows if the phone is diverted.
- Shows if the vibration mode is on.
- Shows that the phone can be used internationally in other countries.
- Shows when a call cannot currently be made.

4-1 How to Fit and Remove the Battery and the SIM card



How to Remove the Battery

Push the separation button up on the mobile phone in the direction of the arrow (1) and pull the battery out with one hand(2).








4-2 How to Charge the Battery


• Connect the adapter to the bottom of your phone.

(The mobile phone is powered-on automatically when the charger is plugged-in) $% \left({{\left[{{{\rm{D}}_{\rm{s}}} \right]}_{\rm{s}}}} \right)$



- Connect the adapter to a standard AC wall outlet. (During charging, the message ' charging 'will appear on the screen.)
- When charging is complete, remove the adapter from the phone by pushing both buttons

(When charging is complete, the status lamp changes color from red to a fluorescent color.)



Note : Use the designated charger Only. The non-approved chargers could result in a fire or injury

through electrical shock and will invalidate all warranties given on this product.

User time was measured based on the standby-time measured in our laboratory.

User time may be shorter depending on the conditions, the degree to which the phone is receiving radio waves, button operation and charging method.

If the battery is totally flat, it may take a few minutes before the charging indication appears on the display or any calls can be made.

Warning : Before you use the phone for the first time, it is important that you fully(for more than 12hours) charge the battery.







4-4 How to Effectively Use the Battery

- Use the designated charger only. Never use other chargers as they may damage the battery.
- Do not put the battery close to firearms or try to take it apart without qualified assistance.

Risk of explosion.

• Do not drop your mobile phone.

Impact on or dropping your phone may cause problems with the electric cell inside the battery pack, and shorten the battery life.

- Main body of the mobile phone or the battery has an increased charging efficiency at room temperature.
- \bullet The mobile phone and the battery have an increased efficiency at 5~45 $\ .$
- Always store the battery at 5~45 .

If you put the battery in a car with the door closed in the summer or in an exceptionally hot or cold place, the battery capacity will be reduced and the service life will be shortened.




• If you are asked to enter a PIN number (Personal Identification Number) in the phone, enter the PIN number and press the left soft button (?) (**OK**).



If the PIN number is entered incorrectly three times in a row, you cannot start using the phone. (Refer to Solving Problems on page 78.)

5-2 Power Off

- Press the End button () for more than 2 seconds.
- Then, the power will turn off after the following screen.



6. General Operations

6-1 Making a Call

6-1-1 Making a Call

- Enter the phone number and press the Send button($\begin{pmatrix} \ddots \\ \ddots \end{pmatrix}$).
- If you enter a wrong number, press the right soft button($\overleftrightarrow{}$) or CLR button ($\Huge{}$ to remove the number.
- Press long Quick dial no(2~9) saved in Phonebook.

6-1-2 Ending a Call

- Close the flip cover or press the End button(\oint).
- If the caller hangs up first, the call will automatically be terminated.

6-1-3 Re-dialing a previously Called Number

- Press the Send button(()) to enter the Call list.
- Scroll through the list with () and () button or side button and select the number you want to call.
 Press the Send key () to make the call.

6-2 Receiving a call

6-2-1 Answering a Call

Single Call Mode

When the phone rings or vibrates, open the flip cover and answer the call.

(When the flip cover is already opened, press the send button

($\langle \cdot \rangle$) or the left soft button ($\langle \cdot \rangle$) to answer the call)

Two Call Mode

Press Send button(), then display the two menu items. 1. End Activated

2. End Held

Press ((), activated call is ended, and accept new call.

Press (), held call is ended, and accept new call.

6-2-2 Rejecting a Call

- Close the flip cover or press the end button ($\cancel{\mathcal{P}}$) or the right soft button (\cancel{S}) to reject the call.
- Press long on the side key to (Reject) the call without opening the folder.

When you are making a call, 'Option" appears in the left soft key. Press this key to use the ongoing call menu. The shape of 'Option" is up to the number of person(2 or over 3 persons).

6-2-3 Speaking between two people or Speaking with more than three people

- Names : Directly move to the phonebook so that you can immediately save the phone number of the phonebook.
- Hold : This option will put the active call on hold.
- Unhold : This option will put held call on a active.

- Mute : You can temporarily mute the microphone of your phone so that the caller cannot hear you.
- Unmute : This option deactivates the Mute function.
- Mute key : This option doesn't transmit the DTMF tones.
- Send key : This option transmits the DTMP tones.

6-4 Manner Mode

- Quickly changes the ring to vibration mode, so as not to inconvenience others in public places or during meetings.
- 1. Press the () button (for more than 2 seconds).

When the phone is automatically changed to vibration mode, the icon will be displayed in the upper part of screen.

2. Press the (2000) button (for more than 2 seconds) once again to cancel the vibration function.

Vibration function will be canceled when the icon disappears from the screen.

If you want to set $\ \mbox{1.SOUND}\ \mbox{Menu}$, you must to cancel Manner Mode.

6-5 How to Use the Earphone

Insert the jack of the earphone into the mobile phone. Open the flip cover, enter the



When receiving a call with the earphone

1. Accept the call Press the Push button of the earphone for more than 1 second to receive a call Press the side button key to receive a call with not a open folder.

2. Reject the call

Press long the side button to reject a call with not a open folder. If you remove the earphone on the call (with not a open folder), the call will be disconnected.













7 Main Menu

7-1 SIM Toolkit

Sewon mobile phones support the SIM Toolkit function required by most common applications.

7-1-1 Setup Menu

• Please insert the SIM card and start your mobile phone. If the SIM card comes with a SIM Toolkit menu, a new entry is added in the main menu as "SIM Tool Kit"

7-1-2 Menu Selection/Select Item

 The SIM Toolkit command "Menu Selection" will display SIM card menu items in the same format as the other phone menus.

7-1-3 Display Text

• The 'Display Text' command can be executed by displaying an information screen with the text contained in the command Pressing any key will remove the screen. This command will be ignored if the phone is in a menu (Except for the SIM Toolkit menu)

7-1-4 Call Control

 If call control is requested by the SIM card, all user entered outgoing calls. SMS and SS/USSD strings are passed to the SIM card and not executed directly. The SIM can modify the user's request to any other - in the form of a Set-up call/send SMS/send SS-string command or ignore the request

7-1-5 Set Up Call

• The Set-up Call command will initiate a call. The user has no control over the number, SMS or string sent and will not see its contents however, the user will see the usual set-up and inprogress screens associated with the call, SMS or string. This command will be ignored if the phone is in a menu (except for the SIM Toolkit Menu)

7-1-6 Send Short Message

 The 'Send Short Message' function will send the message supplied by the SIM to the network. The user is not informed of this operation as it is taking place.

7-1-7 Send SS

• The "Send SS" command will send the SS or USSD string specified in the command to the network. Again, the user is not informed of this operation as it is taking place.

7-1-8 Get Inkev

• The 'Get Inkey" command causes an entry screen to be opened. in the same manner as any other editor in the phone, with a prompt specified in the command. The phone then forwards the next key pressed to the SIM card, and returns to its previous screen. This command will be ignored if the phone is in a menu (except for the SIM Toolkit Menu)

7-1-9 Get Input

• The "Get Input" command also opens an entry screen with a prompt specified in the command. However for this command a complete string can be entered. The string is only forwarded to the SIM when the left soft-kev 'OK' is pressed.

This command will be ignored if the phone is in a menu (except for the SIM Toolkit menu)

7-1-10 Play Tone

• The 'Play Tone" command will play a short beep and if any information string is supplied in the command it will open an information screen with the specified string. The string will remain on the display until a key is pressed or until there is a period of inactivity and it times out.

This command will be executed from any phone state (including menus etc).











However, any information display will be delayed until the phone returns to the idle screen.

7-1-11 Download

 The download command transfers data to the SIM without indication to the user.

7-2 Sounds

• This menu set the Sound mode. (Ring Mode, Select Melody, Voice Volume Etc.)



Press the right soft button to select the Sound in standby mode.

Select "1.SOUND" Menu from the Main Menu and press the left soft button to display the following submenu.

If you want to set "1.SOUND" Menu, you must to cancel Manner Mode.



7-2-1 Ring Mode

- This menu allows you to indicate how you are to be informed of any incoming calls.
- This is a menu to select the Sound/Vibrator/Vib → Sound/Vib.&Sound/Light Only.
- Use the navigation button to select the 'Ring Mode"

submenu. Then press the left soft button.

7-2-3 Voice Volume

- . This is a menu to adjust the Voice Volume.
- Use the navigation button to select the "Voice Volume" submenu. Then press the left soft button.
- Use the Navigation (()) button to adjust volume. Use the side buttons to adjust voice volume during a call. Maximum Voice volume is level 7.

7-2-4 Ring Volume

- This is a menu to adjust the Ring Volume when receiving a call.
- Use the navigation button to select the "Ring Volume" submenu . Then press the left soft button.
- Use the Navigation (()) button to adjust volume. Maximum Ring volume is level 7.

7-2-5 Key Volume

- This is a menu to adjust the Key Tone Volume of the phone when you press any button.
- Use the navigation button to select the "Key Volume" submenu. Then press the left soft button.

7-2-6 Warning Vol.

- This is a menu to adjust the Warning Volume of Warning Tone for SMS,Cell Broad and Net. Found.
- Use the Navigation (()) button to adjust volume. Maximum Ring volume is level 5.

7-2-7 Sel. Key Tone

- This menu selects the type of key tone the phonemakes when you press a button.
- 7-1. Beep

Whenever you press each key, makes the same sound. (Beep sound)

7-2. DTMF

Whenever you press each key, makes a different sound.(DTMF sound)

7-2-8 Warning Tones

- This menu allows you to indicate how you are to be informed of SMS,Cell Broad and Net. Found.
- SMS, Cell Broad have Sub Menu such as Sound, Vibrator.

7-3 Call Logs

- This menu display and saves all call records.
- Press the right soft button to select the Call Logs in standby mode.
- Select "2. CALL LOG" Menu from the Main Menu and press the left soft button to display the following submenu.





7-3-1 Missed Call

- This displays the numbers or names of the last 20 missed calls on the screen.
- Press the up key of the navigation button to display the missed call list when on standby.

7-3-2 Received Call

- This displays the numbers or names of the last 20 received calls on the screen.
- Press the down key of the navigation button to display the received call list when on standby.

7-3-3 Outgoing Call

- This displays the numbers or names of the last 20 outgoing calls on the screen.
- Press the send key to display the outgoing call list when on standby.
- Select one of the above three menus and press the left soft key to see more details.

7-3-4 Call Timers

- . This option displays the duration of the calls made.
- Select this menu and press the left soft keyto display the three functions shown below. Press the right soft key to reset.

"Press OK to Reset"

- Recent : Displays the total duration of the last call.
- Incoming : Displays the total duration of outgoing calls up to the present.
- Outgoing : Displays the total duration of incoming calls up to the present.

7-3-5 Call Charge

- This displays the current status of your phone bill based on call duration.
- Some list on Call Charge require PIN2. If PIN2 is entered incorrectly three times in row, you cannot start these functions. Refer to solving Problems on page 78 to solve this problem.

5-1. Cost Info.

This displays the current status of your phone bill and the remaining time until your next payment.



Last Cost: The cost for the last phone call. Used Cost: The cost for the calls made up to present. Max Cost: Maximum call time available with remaining balance Remains: Remaining balance You need to reset the phone in order to make calls when there is no balance for the Cost

5-2. Reset Cost

This resets the current balance status to 0. The user must supply the PIN2 in order to use this function.

5-3. Cost Limit

This allows the user to set the maximum balance for the call rate. Select this menu and press the left soft key. Then, a message will appear requesting your PIN2 on the screen. Enter the PIN2 on the screen and press the left soft key A screen will appear where you can enter your Max Credit. Enter the new Max Credit here and press the left soft key to complete your new Max Credit.

You can confirm the change of the Max Credit amount by checking the Charge Info display

If the incorrect PIN2 is entered three times in a row, you cannot start this function. Refer to Solving Problems on page 78 to solve this problem.

5-4. Price /Unit

This sets your call costs and the cost of each unit. You must enter your PIN2 in this menu also.

Note : This call charge service may not be available on all networks.











7-4 Messages

- Your phone can receives voice mail and SMS (Short Message Service) message.



3-5 How to Enter English Characters



You can compose a message using the numeric keys from 0 to 9, and the ()key.

Press a key guickly several times to check that one key shows different characters for each press.

Uppercase Mode is the default mode in this phone. Press the (K) key to change it to Lowercase Mode.

Press once to produce character A, twice to produce character B. and three times to produce character C.

(Since Uppercase Mode is set by default, you will see them in upper case.)



3-6 How to Enter English Characters (T9 Type)

This phone supports the T9 type for English input type. You can easily and conveniently compose an English message with the T9 type.

As you see in the figure above, each key is assigned 3 ~4 English characters.

The T9 type is not a type which directly finds and enters the characters, but is a type which mixes the characters in the phone itself and shows them on the screen.


Then, let's make a word.

- 1. Let's make the sentence 'I love you".
- First, press the () button to display upper case I. (Press the) button to convert upper case to lower case, and vice versa, as in the normal way of entering characters.)
- 3. Press the () button, which the character I is assigned to.

7-11 Phonebook

- You can store phone numbers and their corresponding names in the memory of your SIM card. In addition, you can store up to 250 numbers and names in the phone memory.
- Press the left soft button to "Name" the Message in standby mode.
- · You can see the following submenu.



7-11-1 View All

- This show all Phonebook list that stored SIM card and Phone memory.
- Select "View All" in the Phonebook menu and press the left soft key to display the entire of Phonebook list.
- Select the name and press the Send key to make a call.
- · Press the left soft key to display the Options menu. (See[Confer] 7-11-3 (3.1))

7-11-2 Add New Entry

- This stores new phone numbers.
- Select "Add New Entry" in the Phonebook menu and press the left soft key.

- When the screen asks, enter the number and then press the left soft key.
- · Another screen will appear, enters the name.
- After entering the name press the left soft key and a screen will appear to asking for a quick dial number.
- After entering a quick dial number, press the left soft key and a screen will appear asking for the type of memory to be selected.(If select SIM, then the message "Please Wait", "Saved" will appear completing the process)
- After selecting the phone memory and a screen will appear to selecting group list.
- After selecting the group press the left soft button, the message "Please wait", "Saved" will appear completing the process.

If FDN is set, a message will appear requesting your PIN2 before entering a number.

Pressing the End key will return the user to the previous step. Only the digits from 2 to 9 can be assigned a quick dial number An 'Overwrite'' confirmation message will be displayed if a phone number is assigned a quick number already in use. Total number of entries that can be saved in the SIM card phonebook is 254 including ADN, Fixed Dial No., Service Dial No.

7-11-3 Search Phonebook

• This function searches for a phone number in the Phonebook by name or Group.

3-1. Name Search

- Select 'Search "in the 'Phonebook" menu and press the left soft button to show the submenu, "Name Search", "Group Search".
- Select "Name Search" and press the left soft button to display the editor to search by name.
- In standby mode, the phonebook is immediately displayed if the left soft key is pressed.
- When searching within the list, pressing the alphanumeric key pads, 2 to 9, will display name entries that correspond to the letter on the keypad.
- · Select the name and press the Send key to make a call.

• Press the left soft key to display the following menu.

Details: Displays the phone number, Group and Group Led of the selected name.













Edit : Able to edit the name and number of any phone entry.

- 1. Select this menu and press the left soft key.
- Follow the screen prompts to edit the number. Enter the new phone number and press the left soft key. Enter the new name when prompted and press the left soft key. Supply a quick dial number when prompted by the display and press the left soft key.
- The confirmation message "Saved" will be displayed when it has been saved.

If FDN is set, the screen will ask for your PIN2 before changing the contents.

Pressing the End key will return to the user to the previous input step.

Send message: Sends a message to the selected name. Refer to message instructions on page 35~40.

Delete: deletes the selected number.

If FDN is set, you need to enter your PIN2 to delete.

Copy: Copy to memory

- 1. If FDN is set, this menu will not be displayed.
- 2. If the memory of the selected entry is set to SIM, it will be saved in the phone.
- 3. If the memory of the selected entry is set to phone, it will be saved in the SIM.

3-2 Group Search

- Select "Group Search" and press the left soft button to display the group list.
- Select and Group in Group list and left soft button, another screen will appear screen will show the member list including the selected Group.
- Select the name and press the left soft button to display the option menu. (See [Confer] 7-11-3 (3.1))

7-11-4. Edit Group

- This modifies the Group name and Group Led.
- Select "Edit Group" in the Phonebook menu and press the left soft key.
- Another screen will appear to show the Group list.
- Select the Group name and press the left soft key to display Options menu.
- 4-1 Name Edit
- Able to edit the Group name of any Group list.

Select this menu and press the left soft key. Enter the new Group name and press the left soft key to save. The confirmation message 'Saved" will be displayed when it has been saved.

4-2 Group Led

• Able to select the Group Led of any Group list.

4-3 Member View

- This shows member list.
- Select the name and press the left soft button to display the option menu. (See [Confer] 7-11-1(3-1)).

7-11-5 Memory Status

- · This menu displays the current memory status.
- You can check how many numbers are stored in the Phonebook. (SIM card and phone memories)

Each SIM card has a different storage capacity. Refer to your service operator for details of storage capacity.











7-11-6 Own Number

- Own Number : This menu shows the user's own phone number registered on the SIM card.
- Select "Own Number" in the Phonebook menu and press the left soft key to display the screen as follows:

7-11-7 Service No.

 Service No. : This menu shows the list of Services Dialing numbers (SDN) assigned by your network operator/service provider in the SIM card. The user can use these telephone numbers to make outgoing calls.

7-12 Solving Problems

 Check these points to ascertain if the phone is broken or not. This way, you can prevent unnecessary wastage of time and money.

Symptoms		How to Solve the Problem
When this message appears on the screen	SIM Invalid	Check whether you have inserted the SIM card in the phone, and whether you have inserted it correctly.
	Enter PIN	PIN is set by the user to prevent others from using this phone. In this case, enter your PIN.
	Enter PUK	This message appears when the PIN is incorrectly entered three times in a row. At this time, enter the PUK you received when you purchased the SIM card in order to use your phone again. If the PUK is incorrectly entered more than 10 times, your SIM card will be permanently blocked, and you need to purchase a new SIM card.
	Message "Searching" is displayed along with "No Network" or % mark.	 When this happens in a service area, turn the power off wait 2-3 minutes, and then turn the power on again. If you are passing through a tunnel or are in a densely built up area, the network signal may be weakened or disconnected. In this case, move to another location and try again. If this continues for some time without reason, contact the service center nearest you.
You cannot make a call even though you have entered the number and pressed the Send button		 Check whether you are in a service area. (If you are not in a service area, will be displayed on the screen.) Check whether you have set Outgoing Calls to be barred. If this function is set, you cannot make a call. (You can check All Outgoing menu in the Call Barring menu of the Security menu.)
No incoming calls from others		 Check whether you are in a service area. (If you are not in a service area, will be displayed on the screen.) Check whether you have set Incoming Calls to be barred. If this function is set, you cannot receive calls. (You can check All Incoming menu in the Call Barring menu of the Security menu)











7-13 Emergency Calls

- This is a function that the user can use when in an emergency or dangerous situation. The user can dial "112" wherever they are to make an emergency call.
- Even if your phone is receiving a travelling service in another country, when you dial "112" the network will automatically connect you to the emergency service of that country.
- You can make an emergency call without entering the phone password, even when the Phone Lock is set on your phone.
- You can use the Emergency Call function without entering the PIN even if the PIN is activated on your phone. In this case, when you enter Emergency number ("112"), call will appear in the left soft button. (If it is not an Emergency Call, CK will appear.)
- You can use this function even if your phone is in SIM Invalid status (No SIM card). When you power on your phone, "SOS" is assigned in the left soft key. If you press Emergency Call Number and press the right soft key (SOS), cerr will appear in the left soft key.
- You can use this function even if there is no registered network but other networks exist.
- You can use this function even if your phone is currently searching for a registered network.
- You can make an emergency call even if the Call Barring or Fixed Dial No. function is set on your phone.

7-14 Terms

- GSM (Global System for Mobile Communication) International standard on cellular communication which guarantees compatibility between various network operators. GSM covers many countries in the world, including most European countries.
- Line identification Services (Caller ID) This function displays or blocks the phone number of callers.
- PIN (Personal Identification Number)

A code that prevents others from accessing the users' phone, provided by the service provider along with the SIM card. The user can change the PIN after receiving it from the service provider.

SG4000

PUK (PIN Unblocking Key)

An 8 digit security code which unblocks the phone when the PIN code has been entered incorrectly three times in a row. It is provided by the service provider along with the SIM card. When PUK is entered incorrectly more than 10 times in a row, the SIM is permanently blocked.

• PIN2

PIN2 is a code to block others from accessing the personal information the user has entered. This code is requested when FDN is set. Like PIN, the user can change this after receiving it from the service provider. However, not all SIM cards have a PIN2.

PUK2

PUK2 is an 8 bit code to unblock the phone when the PIN2 has been entered incorrectly three times in a row (like PUK). It is provided by the service provider when you purchase SIM card.







• FDN (Fixed Dial Number)

This function prohibits the forwarding of messages or outgoing calls except to the numbers that are already designated. When this function is set, the user will be prompted to enter PIN2 when he uses a function affected by FDN.

• Travelling

This function allows the user to use the phone in other countries except the home country. Of course, since this service is not provided in all countries, please contact the service provider in advance for details on which countries this service is available in.

Dual Band

This function allows the user to operate all GSM networks and DCS. Your phone will automatically use the network with the strongest signal, and the network can be converted while you are making a call if it is within the networks of the same operator.

Service Center

This number is the number that the user needs to enter in the phone to receive a message service. You cannot receive this service without this number. Contact your service provider to find out this number.

SIM (Subscriber Identification Module)


This is a card that contains a chip which contains all the information (personal data of the subscriber, network and memory information) required to operate the phone. However, the storage capacity may differ for each SIM card.


SMS (Short Message Service)


This is a short message (below 160 characters) service between subscribers.




7-15 Menu Map


