



SIM CARD SERVICES

3. SIM Card Services

In addition to the functions available in the phone, your SIM card is capable of providing additional services that you can access through Menu 0, SIM Services. Menu 0 will be shown only if your SIM card supports it. The items and contents of the menu depend entirely on the SIM card.

3.1 PIN (Personal Identification Number) - 4 to 8 digits

PIN code, supplied with your SIM card, is used to safeguard your Phone/SIM card against unauthorized use. If wrong PIN code is entered three times in a row, the phone will request for the PUK code.

3.2 PIN2 (Personal Identification Number 2) - 4 to 8 digits

PIN2 code, supplied with certain SIM cards, is used to access specific functions of your SIM card. For example, PIN2 code can be used to set Fixed Dialing Number. These functions are only available if supported by the SIM card. If wrong PIN2 code is entered three times in a row, the phone will request for the PUK2 code.

3.3 PUK (PIN Unblocking Key) - 8 digits

PUK code that may have been supplied with your SIM card is required to change a blocked PIN code. If wrong PUK code is entered ten times in a row, the SIM will be permanently blocked. Contact your service provider for a new card.

3.4 PUK2 (PIN Unblocking Key 2) - 8 digits

PUK2 code that may have been supplied with certain SIM cards is required to change a blocked PIN2 code. If wrong PUK2 code is entered ten times in a row, the SIM will be permanently blocked. Contact your service provider for a new card.

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4. Call Functions

4.1 Making calls

Local call

- When the idle screen is displayed, enter the desired phone number including the area code.
- 2. Press (SEND] key.

Speed dialing

Press and hold a numeric key (from [2] to [9]) that the entry number is assigned to form the speed dial list. By doing so, number assigned to the key will be automatically dialed.

Making a call using Phonebook

The phone stores numbers dialed and received. Frequently dialed numbers can be also stored with assigned names in the SIM card or the phone's memory, referred to as Phonebook. Then simply select the desired name to recall the associated number.

Refer to the Phonebook section.

Entering a "Pause" in a dial string

A pause character can be entered into a dial string by pressing and holding down [*] key until a 'p' sign appears.

4.2 Answering a call



Note: To communicate with answering machines, the Send DTMF option must be selected.





Outbox message (Menu 2-1-2)

The number on the right side of the Outbox indicates the amount of messages. With this menu, saved text messages can be viewed. Destination name or number is displayed on the list. Pressing (Select) will display message contents with the destination name and number (if stored in Phonebook).

While reading a message, the following options can be selected by pressing (**) [Select].

Delete: Deletes the viewed message.



Voice message (Menu 2-3)

Your phone is capable of handling voice message services if supported by the network.

Set VM server number (Menu 2-3-1)

Allows the user to change the number of the voice message server.

Dial to VM server (Menu 2-3-2)

Select this option to listen to your messages.

This function allows for quick connection to the voice server by pressing and holding down (IT) [1 key] from the idle mode.

Template (Menu 2-4)

Up to ten most frequently used messages are pre-composed and saved.

The title of each template is displayed in a list format.

Edit: Enables editing of viewed message contents.

Send & save: Sends and saves the messages to Outbox.

Delete: Deletes viewed messages.

Status report: When this function is activated, the network informs the user of whether the message has been delivered or not.

Password setup (Menu 2-5-3)

Select Password setup and press (Select) to access the following options:

Password setting: Setting this menu to On will configure the phone to

request for the SMS Password whenever

a SMS message arrives and when it is checked.

Info message (Menu 2-6)

Inbox message (Menu 2-6-1)

With this menu, new info messages can be viewed or read.

Channel ID is displayed in the list.

Pressing (Select) will display the message content and its arrival time.

When reading a message, pressing Delete will delete the viewed message.

Setup (Menu 2-6-2)

Selecting Enable will allow you to receive Info messages.

Channel (Menu 2-6-3)

Allows the user to select channels to receive broadcasted messages from. The following options are available:

All channel mode: The user receives all channel Info messages.

Add new channel: Adds new channels.
